



HAD BROKEN FENDER SCORED FOR LETTING IT LEAVE THE BARNs.

Little Tot Was Killed—Only Hand-brakes Were Used—Coroner Thought Motorman Was to Blame.

Winnipeg, July 8.—The coroner's jury investigating the death of little Alice Day, aged three, killed by a street car, on July 1st, found that the motorman did his best with the means at hand to stop the car, but scored the Winipeg Electric Railway company for permitting the car to leave the barn with a defective and dilapidated fender, and also for the brief training and inexperience of the company's motormen.

The coroner disagreed with the exoneration of Motorman Lewis, and indeed, charged heavily against him.

The evidence showed that the little tot was playing on the boulevard and ran in front of the car, which was an old-fashioned, single-truck car, equipped only with hand-brakes, and which was also drawing a trailer. The motorman was horror-stricken, and reversed and threw the circuit-breaker without avail. The fender apparently rolled the child, and passed over it, but several slats were broken, which would permit quite a large body to go through. The motorman testified that he protested against using the fender, but was told it was all right. The motorman had a fortnight's tuition from other motormen, but has been running cars since February.

Lost 21 Pounds In Weight.

THIS WAS THE DAY

For Disastrous Earthquakes in Southern Italy.

Rome, July 8.—An entire army corps, in small detachments, is scattered throughout Southern Italy, maintaining order among the thousands who have fled from their homes because of the prediction of seismological experts that the severest earthquake Italy has ever experienced will occur to-day. Towns throughout Calabria and Sicily are practically deserted, the inhabitants camping in the fields patiently awaiting the expected destruction of their home. Meanwhile herds of outlaws have taken possession of the deserted towns and villages, plundering the abandoned houses and wantonly destroying property. Several clashes between outlaws and the troops are reported.

SPECIAL AMMUNITION.

It Will Be Used By Palma Trophy Team.

Ottawa, July 8.—5,000 rounds of special ammunition for the Palma trophy team, to represent Canada, has been received by the D.R.A. It is a pointed bullet and said to be most effective for long range shooting. Some of these will be sent away to the big long distance shots in various parts of Canada for practice shooting—and the balance will be kept. Should the D.R.A. decide to send a team for the match, as it is more than probable they will, the balance will be sufficient for the team for practice purposes before the match and for the match itself.

TO SUE THE POPE.

Holy See Took Possession of Estate.

Rome, July 8.—Three pieces of the late Bishop Adams have taken preliminary steps toward a suit against the pope and the holy see for the restitution of the estate of their uncle, of which the holy see took possession after his death. The vatican officials declare that Bishop Adams bequeathed everything he possessed to the pope. The action is likely to be sensational. The sum involved is

left to the Pope.

Home Grown New Potatoes.

Halifax, N.S., July 8.—Some 510 men and 24 officers from the Royal Artillery and Royal Canadian Regiment, left here at 5.45 o'clock, this morning, for the scene of the miners' strike, in Cape Breton. The force, under the command of Col. Wadsworth, R.C.R., with Major McDonald as staff officer, takes with it two machine guns and a complete equipment. It will not reach Sydney until five o'clock this evening. All is quiet at the mines today, according to the latest reports.
