Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

FORCE STIRRED UP

LONDON POLICEMAN WAS NOTED THIEF.

His Criminal Past Disclosed by the Evidence of Finger Prints—Will Make Tests Hereafter.

London, July 24.—The fact that a convicted thief had been noted as a policeman in London since April last was revealed at the London sessions, yesterday.

After John Fuller, who joined the force on April 26th, went to live at the Knattish town section house numerous small thefts occurred in the house. Suspicion did not fall on Fuller, but on other policemen. In one case a vest was removed from one locker to another, apparently with the object of casting suspicion on another policeman.

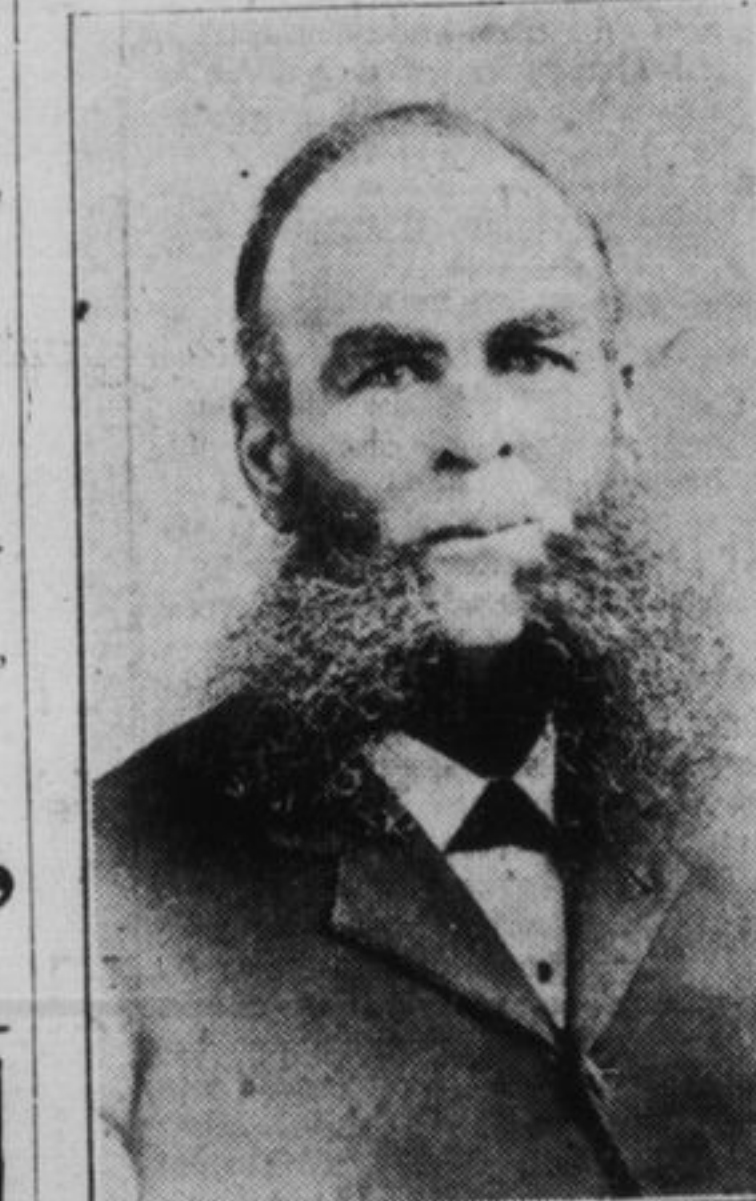
Eventually Fuller was caught stealing a bank book belonging to a detective. His finger prints were taken and it was discovered that in 1905 he was found over for stealing a bicycle, and that in 1906, he underwent three months' imprisonment.

It was stated, yesterday, that the references he produced when he joined the force were satisfactory, and that he had left the army with a good character.

A detective who had been present when Fuller was previously convicted corroborated the finger-print evidence and sentence of twelve months' imprisonment was passed.

Fuller, who had strongly protested his innocence, left the dock smiling.

It is understood that in consequence of the case the finger prints of all future applicants for admission to the force will be taken.

PERIL AMIDST LUXURY.

Three Trains Used When Czar Travels.

St. Petersburg, July 21.—Three extremely similar imperial trains were in readiness at Peterhof for the czar's journey to Pultava for the recent national celebrations there. All the court dignitaries and many members of the cabinet are assembled at the station awaiting the emperor's departure.

Nobody knew in which train his majesty travelled. On such occasions he generally occupies the second train, but often, for reasons of safety, a change is made during the journey. One of the trains acts as a pilot train, and the others follow at distances of about two miles.

The imperial trains have the most luxurious equipment, each being composed of sleeping and dining saloon cars and of a kitchen car.

The apartments of the imperial suite are beautifully decorated, while the czar's own bedroom is adorned in white and gold, and contains beautiful cabinets. A smaller dressing-room adjoins the bedroom. The czar's valet and Cossack retainers sleep in the same car as the emperor.

The troops lining the railway turn their backs to the motive as the imperial train approaches, and watch the fields with loaded rifles. No one is ever allowed to approach the line.

The cost of imperial journeys is always enormous, and the luxury displayed is probably unequalled in any other country.

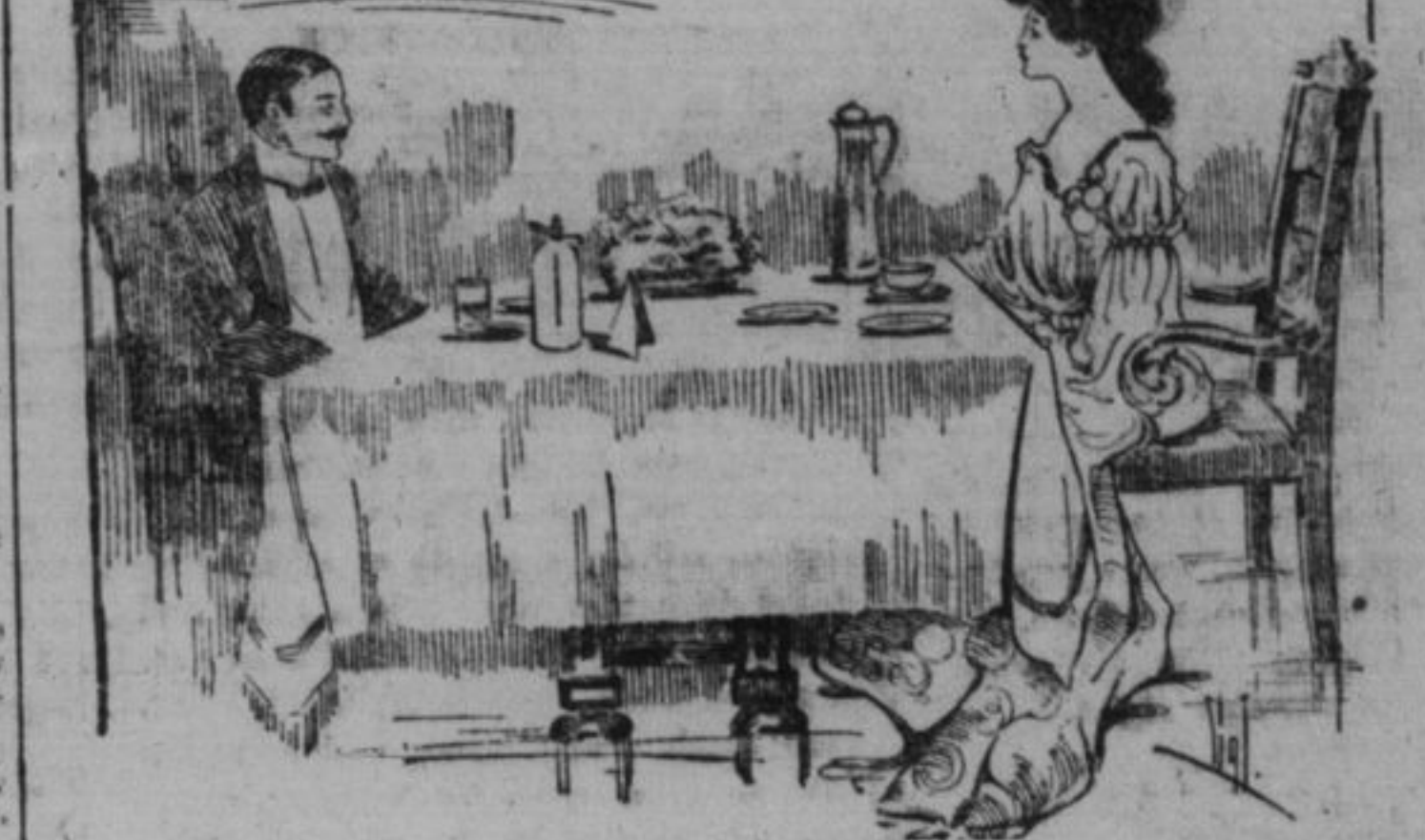
