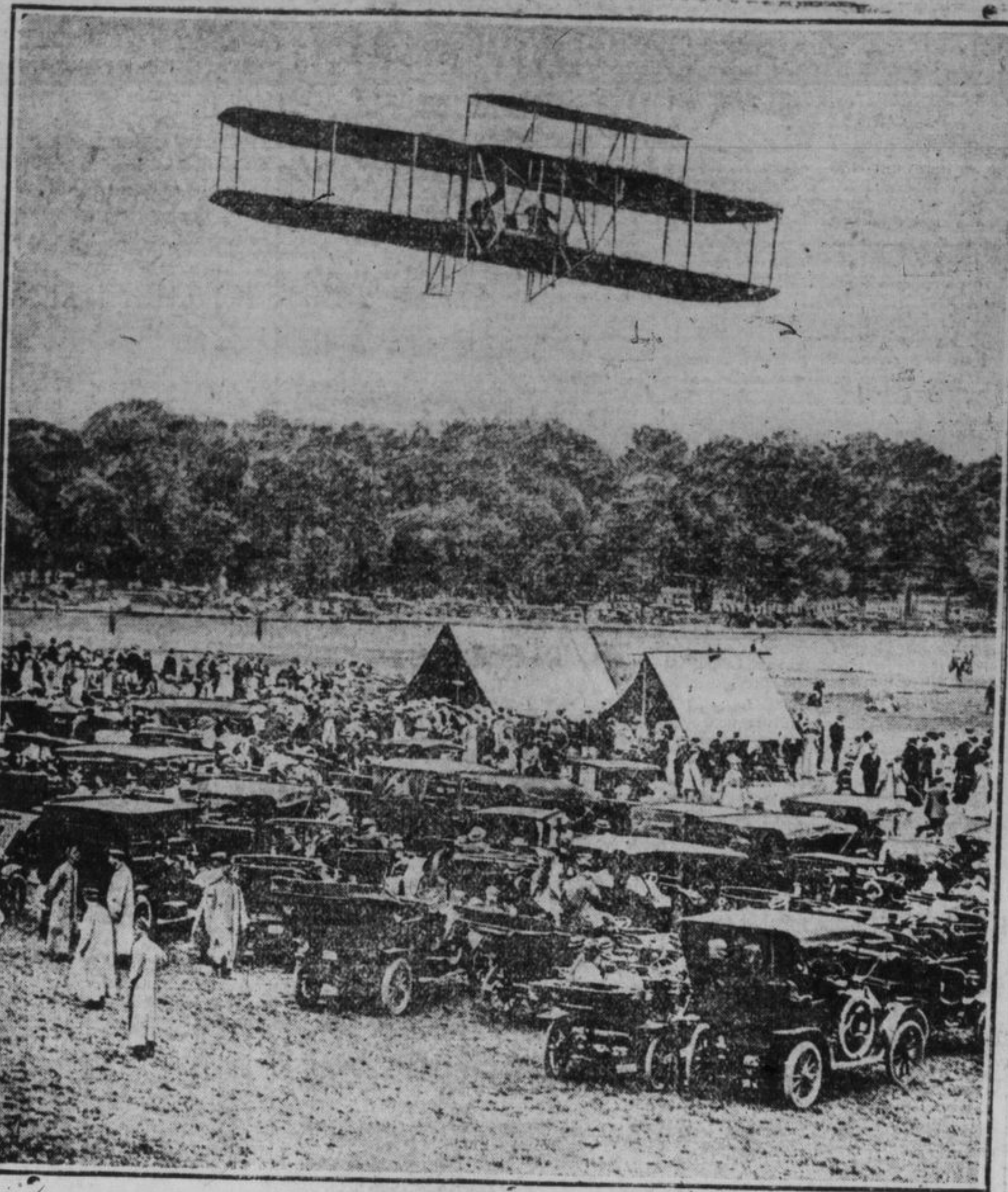
TO CRUSH OUT WAR.
