## MURDERER ON RANCH

TRACES FOUND OF MAN WHO KILLED DECKER.

He Confided in a Fellow-workman, But the Authorities Did Not Hear of His Presence Until it Was Too Late to Arrest Him.

Vancouver, B.C., Aug. 5.—According to a story in the Ashcroft Journal, the murderer of Decker worked on "Doe's" English's ranch, Verrals valley, a few days after the murder. The "Doe"—sent his son to Spence's Bridge to hire help. The murderer offered and was engaged. The murderer made a confidant of another hired man named Armstrong. He said Decker first fired. After killing Decker the murderer took the first bench above the town, working westward, getting as far as Spences' Bridge five days after the killing. He was hard pressed several times. Armstrong describes the murderer as five feet seven inches in height, stockily built, clean shaven, and of French-Canadian extraction.

After working three days the murderer left. He told Armstrong he wanted to see the North-West Territories. Armstrong, cowed by the murderer, said nothing until too late.

Although the doctors have hopes that she will recover, she was in a bad state when taken to the hospital and will be laid up some time as a result.
