Montreal, Ang. 7 .- To die within a few minutes of the time he was to meet his daughter, whom he was coming to visit, was the fate of George Denmark, of Belleville, Ont. He was taking a well-carned holiday from his law office, and when he arrived here he started to walk to the Royal Victoria hospital, where his daughter is a nurse, and they had planned to make a number of water trips from

He collapsed in the street, and a student picked him up and took him to the hospital in a cab. But he died on the way, and the daughter, who was waiting to welcome him, identified the body as that of her father. The shock was so great that at first there were fears for her reason, but her work as a nurse had its effect in being to a certain extent prepared for these things, and she recovered. The hody was sent home last night.


