CITY CLOCK IN DARKNESS.

Whereas it Should Be Lighted Through the Night.

Feople going to and coming from 3 the G.T.R. station after midnight "Fresh on Saturday" beef iron and wonder why the city should be so light from the dials in the city dome runeway, one that might have had The trouble is that when a man tries clock after eleven o'clock. According very serious results, but as it did not, to forge la woman she won't let him. to the chairman of the city property committee the cost of lighting the dials now is less than one-half of what it cost to light the old ones. Probably not more than \$50 a year is expended for the present lighting. The dominion government withdrew its old grant of \$385 for the city dome lights, which were an aid to navigation. Now the city has not only withdrawn the lights facing the harbor but also those in the King 3 street dial, so that before midnight the "town clock" is in absolute darkness. The people don't like this They would prefer that an additional sco a year be spent so that the lights could be placed in operation all right. If the property committee wants to get even with the dominion government for the withdrawal of the old grant it can do so without cuting off the lights from the King street dial. Kingston shouldn't be allowed to lapse into village style-lights out at eleven or twelve o'clock.
