## Tips For The Farmers BY UNCLE JOSH.

Rain has been general all over Ontario within the past two weeks. These showers have had a most beneficial effect not only on the crop, but also assisted in making up the second cut of clover and in maintaining the pasture in good condition.

A further beneficial effect will follow from the downfall in making it easier to carry on after-harvest cultivation. Never was such cultivation more necessary than it is to-day. From all over the province come reports as to the prevalence of the wood tick. The most important duty resting upon Ontario farmers to-day from a material standpoint, is the taking of measures intended to get rid of this evil. In order to be successful all must join in, because if one weedy farm is left, half a dozen well cultivated farms in the neighborhood may be seeded down from it. Especially important it is that all harvest fields, in which grass has not been sown, shall be cultivated lightly directly after removal of the crop, with a view of germinating any foul seeds in the ground, to the end that plants may be destroyed by further cultivation later in the season.

The second report from the dairy instructors and inspectors of Ontario department of agriculture has been re-

It is quite evident that the farmers of Ontario generally are looking for better crops than for the past two years, and they seem to be in much better spirits on that account. The quantity of milk available for the manufacture of cheese and butter was much below the average last year, and the early part of this year, but all through the present season there has been a slight increase, and at this time there appears to be a marked increase over the available milk supply of this time last year, while the milk producers seem to be making an effort to improve their milk production.

The prospects for the remaining months are bright, and the balance of the year should be up to the average of the production of butter and cheese for the season of 1907.

As regards field crops, the instructors report that the general crops, such as oats, corn, etc., are from an average to a very good yield, but the hay crop is recorded pretty generally to be short, and in some cases to be as low as one-half to one-third of the average.

While the instructors' report that there is still a great deal of opposition on the part of the farmers of taking suggestions for improving the standard of the cheese and butter industry, still they at the same time report a decided improvement in this respect.

Frank Fowler, secretary of the Grain Dealers' Association, of Winnipeg, says that unless something unforeseen happens, ninety per cent of the Manitoba wheat crop will be cut by the end of this week.


