GREAT LABOR PICNIC AT LAKE ONTARIO PARK ON MONDAY.

Stinson Won the Ten Mile Track Race—The Orientals Defeated Victoria's at Baseball By 3 to 0.

Labor Day, 1909, will long be remembered by all who were present at the gigantic picnic of the Trades and Labor Council at Lake Ontario Park, on Monday. During the afternoon fully 6,000 people were present. The weather man must surely belong to the union because he handed out a fine day, just cool enough for players and spectators. The different committees must be congratulated on the way everything was run off, not a hitch occurring at any part of the proceedings.

Every car into the park after four o'clock carried a full load, and the traffic became so heavy that the belt cars were taken off, and all ran the one way around the city to the picnic. One thing that must be mentioned was the way the large crowd was handled. At no time was any one allowed on the field, but the officials, and every one saw "better," and enjoyed things more than if they had been allowed on the field.

Stinson Won Distance Race.

The main event was the ten-mile race, run off on a circular track, four laps to the mile. The track was well wired off, and the turf track was in fine shape for the race. Due to unavoidable circumstances, only six men entered. Both O'Brien and Cole, the two outside runners, who were counted on to make things interesting did not show up. Cole could not get away from Deseronto, and O'Brien sprained a tendon in his right leg while running in Gananoque a few days ago. The only outside runner was Edgar Cummings; the plucky little Gananoquean who has earned much applause for his race. The following men lined up at the start:

H. Stinson, R.C.H.A.; G. Smith, City H. Nicholson, Port Hope, and Halligan, city; H. Jackson, city; E. Cummings, Gananoque.

The officials were: W. F. Nickle, M.P.P., starter; W. W. Gibson, time-keeper; Major Compton, Ald. Angrove, and William Driscoll, judges; J. J. Thompson, clerk of the course.

Harry Stinson, the winner, ran the head race. He took the lead at the start, and during the race lapped every one of his competitors, some of them two and three times. He has a nice easy stride and runs his own race all through. He was never pressed and showed no signs of distress at any time, finishing with a fine burst of speed, that showed clearly he was good for at least five miles more. His victory was deserved, and brought joy to the hearts of the soldiers present.

At the first lap Stinson jumped into the lead, with Jackson second and Smith a close third. Cummings ran fourth, Halligan fifth and Nicholson sixth. The only change in the first half mile was between the last three, Nicholson taking fourth place, Cummings fifth and Halligan sixth.

They were in the same position at the end of the first mile, which was covered in 5:50, by Stinson, with the others slightly spread out.

In the first part of the second mile Stinson jumped into fourth place, Halligan taking fifth, and Nicholson sixth. Stinson had about a hundred yards on Jackson and Smith, who were running a beautiful race for second and third place, not three yards separating them. The three men held their positions from start to finish, although both were lapped by Stinson. The second mile was covered in 6:06.

At the beginning of the third mile Nicholson began to show signs of distress, and at the end of the second lap of the third mile he dropped out, suffering from a severe pain in his left side. He was attended to and soon came around all right. This left five men in the race. Stinson first, Jackson second, Smith, third, Cummings, fourth, and Halligan, fifth. They ran in this order from the second lap of the third mile until the first lap of the ninth mile when Cummings dropped back to fifth place, Halligan taking fourth.

The third mile was covered in 6:44, the fourth in 8:01, the fifth in 6:10, the sixth in 7:37, the seventh in 7:58, the eighth in 7:36, the ninth in 7:55, and the tenth in 7:59.

At the end of the first lap in the ninth mile Cummings held out the distress signal, and on the advice of the judges he left the track, although he felt that he could finish.
