

The civic finance committee nev has been instructed to provide \$100 for the purpose. It is understood that i will be difficult to get two-thirds of the property owners on Princess street to of the property on that thorough fare is owned by corporations and absentees. These classes of owners are no

very willing to have expense added to their properties. However, the canvass should be made known to the city council. Before, the council can order street paying on the local improvement plan without consulting the property owners, a three-fourth vote in favor required. Last year the vote was 15 whereas seventeen votes were required to carry the project.
