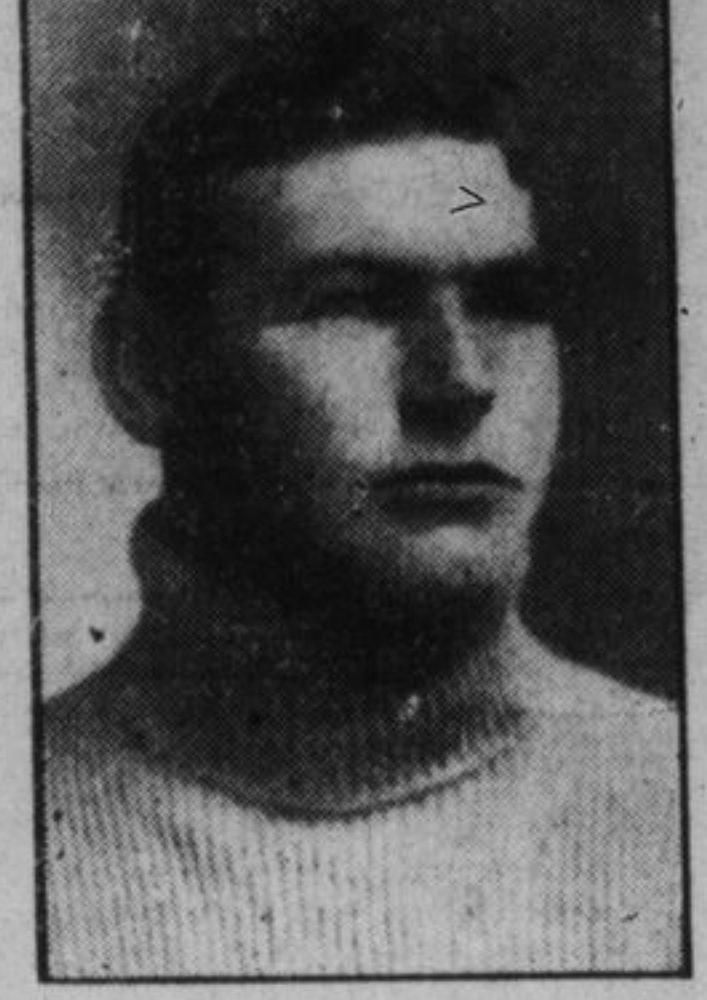
QUEEN'S HOLDS ITS FIRST RUGBY PRACTICE.
