THEY ARE STILL LOST

THE TEN TRIBES STILL AMONG MISSING.

The Mormon Revelation Placing Them at North Pole Punished By Explorers.

Salt Lake City, Utah, Sept. 25.—Mormonism in Utah got a severe jolt when the announcement was made by Dr. Cook and Commander Peary that the North Pole country had been discovered and found to be nothing more than a break desert of ice.

Since the beginning of Mormonism the followers have clung to the theory of the land about the pole being occupied by the descendants of the ten tribes of Israel who left Palestine a few centuries before Christ and travelled in a northerly direction for a year and a half.

Through a series of remarkable discoveries and revelations the Mormons claimed to have located the descendants of the ten tribes at the North Pole, which must surely have been their stopping place if they travelled north from Palestine for a year and a half.

To confirm the theory that the descendants, probably many millions in number, were in the North Pole country, the Books of Isaiah and Jeremiah were referred to by the Mormon elders and missionaries. In these books many references are made to the Lord's people of the north, and how they would be brought down from the north.

Joseph Smith, the Jewish historian, is sponsor for the statement that the ten tribes went north for a year and a half. Through revelations and inspirations the descendants being co-favorites of the Lord with the Mormons.

The ten tribes were the chosen people of the Lord in the early days, while the Mormons claim to be the chosen people of the latter days, and for that reason they call themselves Latter-Day Saints.

A sense of protection always has been felt by the Mormons in the teachings that in the day when they were in the sorest need of help from the opponents of their religion, the North Pole must march down to Utah and combine forces with the Mormons.

Led by the Lord, the two armies of saints would be a world power, and all other religions would fall before the progress of "the army of the Lord."

With the discovery of the pole and the failure of the discoverers to locate the missing tribes, Mormonism is suffering considerable ridicule from those who often have listened to the Mormon elders staunchly advocating the North Pole theory.

It is up to the teachers to arrange a new account of the whereabouts of the ten tribes and their descendants. No explanation has been offered yet by the president and chief revelator of the church.

LAC LA RONGE MINERALS.

Find of Quicksilver Causes Some Excitement.

Princes Albert, Sask., Sept. 25.—Rich gold samples from the famous Lac La Ronge country to the north of here caused no excitement when shown here, but, yesterday, John Donaldson and Henry McLeod, two prospectors, arrived down with a quantity of quicksilver, and interest in the far north again went to fever heat.

The deposit from whence their samples came is extensive and very rich. Donaldson is the Australian miner, who, after looking all over the world, came here, and, soon after going north, made the find of cinabar rock.

So far the report from the analyst have not been received, but locally it is believed the number is the real thing, and should this prove true the find is one of great importance.

RABBI UNDER ARREST.

Wanted on Warrant, Charging Larceny and Bigamy.

Chicago, Sept. 25.—Ascher Lewin, aged thirty-one years, a Jewish rabbi, under indictment in New York on charges of grand larceny and bigamy, is under arrest here. Lewin is accused of having deserted his wife in Germany and taking her money and jewelry. He then went to New York, where he is alleged to have assumed the name of Alphonse Friedlander and later appeared in a synagogue.

Later he is accused of marrying Miss Hymann, his second wife. He came to Chicago six months ago and has been appearing with his wife in nickel theatres.

'CAR ENTERED SALOON.

Motorman Was Killed By It Rolling on Him.

Yonkers, N.Y., Sept. 25.—William Stelze, a motorman of Yonkers, was killed when his car left the rails and crashed through the front window of a saloon. The conductor and three passengers on the car escaped injury.

It is thought that Stelze took a switch at too high a speed, sending the car off the rails. The car jumped the curb, dashed across the sidewalk and smashed into the big front window of Henry Schaffer's saloon. Stelze was thrown from the car and as it went over on its side, was pinned under it. He was dead when taken out.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta.

Such a person must apply in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. He must be a Canadian citizen, or a person who has been naturalized in accordance with the laws of the Dominion.
