Prospector Traced Vein For Over Two Miles.

Edmonton, Alta., Oct. 11.-A prospector just in from the Peace River canyon, which lies beyond the great divide a short distance, brings in news of a remarkable discovery of mica in MR. AND MRS. NICK HUGHES that distant isolated country. He prospected a vein for over two miles. and found it to average about fifty feet in thickness and of unknown depth. The quality is remarkably fine and it can be lifted in great sheets of the purest material. The mica is worth from \$25 to \$100 per ton, a price which makes this mine richer and more important as a commercial commodity than any gold mine discovered. It lies just beyond the divide at the foot of Mount Selwin.
