## QUEEN'S AND COLLEGIATES IN OTTAWA.

No Friction Between Williams and Queen's Management—Queen's II and R.M.C. I Played This Afternoon.

Queen's seniors left at eight o'clock this morning for Ottawa, to play their second game of the season with the Ottawa Collegiate. The boys felt confident of winning, despite their defeat on Saturday last, by Varsity. The line-up could not be ascertained, as the management were not sure just who would go on. The following players went down: Campbell, Crawford, Williams, Leckie, Dickson, Moran, Mosley, Clark, O'Connell, Kinsella, Gallagher, McLeish, Lloyd, McKay, Erskine, Elliott and Smith. E. O. Sitter also accompanied the team, with trainers McLaughlin and Campbell.

Collegiate vs. Ottawa. The Collegiate team took in the excursion to the capital, today, and were scheduled to play the Ottawa Collegiate, on Varsity oval, before the big game. The team was to line up as follows: Full-back, Leo Williams; halves, McNeil, Goodearle, LaRush; quarter, McGowan; scrumming, Black-McCannon, Hazlett; middle wings, Millan, Stewart; outside wings, Shaw, Reid, Humphrey May and E. Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or of any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Entry—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father,
