## NEWS OF RAILROADS

### EARNINGS SHOW PHENOMENAL INCREASE.

Mileage Much Increased—Good Progress Being Made on G.T.P. Elevator System at Fort William.

Montreal, Oct. 29.—The phenomenal heavy earnings of the Canadian Pacific still continue without any sign of a break, and it is practically certain that there will be no appreciable diminution in the figures until the close of lake navigation, as there is always a tremendous rush of freight both east and west during the last month of lake shipping. Records have been given by the board with a regularity that is almost monotonous and now is the first time in its career that the big Canadian road has registered four consecutive weeks' earnings of over two million dollars, earnings during the month having averaged well over \$300,000 a day. Such figures well justify the optimism of railway men in Canada and their active preparations for a busy year.

During the third week of October the gross earnings of the C.P.R. totalled \$2,147,000, an increase of \$454,100 over the earnings for the same week last year, \$1,692,900, which was the biggest straight week of the whole of the lean year 1908. The gross earnings of the system for the past four weeks reached a total of \$9,223,000. It is, however, only natural that the receipts of the system should show large increases, as not only has the business of the country greatly improved of late, but the company is operating some 700 miles more track than they did last year.

Steady increases are also being shown week by week by the Grand Trunk. Their earnings for the past week were \$904,674, as against \$841,100 last year, an increase of \$63,574. These figures, however, do not include the earnings of the seven hundred miles of completed road on the Grand Trunk Pacific, which are reported to have been doing a heavy traffic in grain, as well as a steady passenger business. The completed section is still being run by the construction department, so that all earnings of the road are simply credited to that department.

### Thanksgiving Day Success.

Montreal Star. We cannot avoid reminding the government what a success they have again made of it in fixing Thanksgiving Day for the month of fine autumn weather. There are always forces striving to induce the ministers to go back to the "back" old system which Thanksgiving came late in November, long after we had ceased to remember what sort of a harvest we had reaped to be thankful for and at a season when the day was fairly certain to be cheerless and gloomy. About the only people who are really accommodated by the change are the stock speculators who would prefer not to have two stock exchange holidays for Thanksgiving purposes. Now they have our own; and they might as well observe the American as well. But the great bulk of the people gain by an early Thanksgiving. They get a real holiday out of doors just at the threshold of winter when a holiday is needed. Then the Monday celebration permits thousands of people to go home for this home festival. Take it altogether, a late Monday in October is the ideal Canadian Thanksgiving.

### SIX MONTHS AND \$1,000 FINE.

Penalty Imposed on Prominent Brantford Citizen

Brantford, Ont., Oct. 27.—Joseph Bowes, a resident of this city for fifty-two years, and who is in his seventy-third year, was found guilty to-day before Judge Hardy, in the county court, of indecent assault, and was sentenced to six months in prison. In addition he was fined \$1,000. The charge was laid by William Osborne, father of a seven-year-old girl, and arose out of a drive to the outskirts of the city which Bowes took with the girl on July 8th last.

Bowes had held several offices of public trust and was chairman of the board of health when arrested. His counsel, L. F. Heyd, asked for a reserve case, which was granted. The argument will be heard before the court of appeal within a week. In the meantime he was allowed bail on \$5,000 bail. His counsel claimed that there was lack of sufficient corroboration of the child's story to find a conviction. Bowes is a man of considerable means.

The bidding opened at 10c, and sales were made as follows: At 11c, Mr. Lancaster bought the offerings of Arigan, Catarqui, Cold Springs, Glenburnie, Kossan's, Latimer, Morning Star, Pine Hill, Sunbury and McGrath's; at the same figure Mr. Thompson secured St. Lawrence, Silver Springs, Thousand Islands and Rose Hill; at 11 1/2c, Mr. Alexander secured Glenvale.

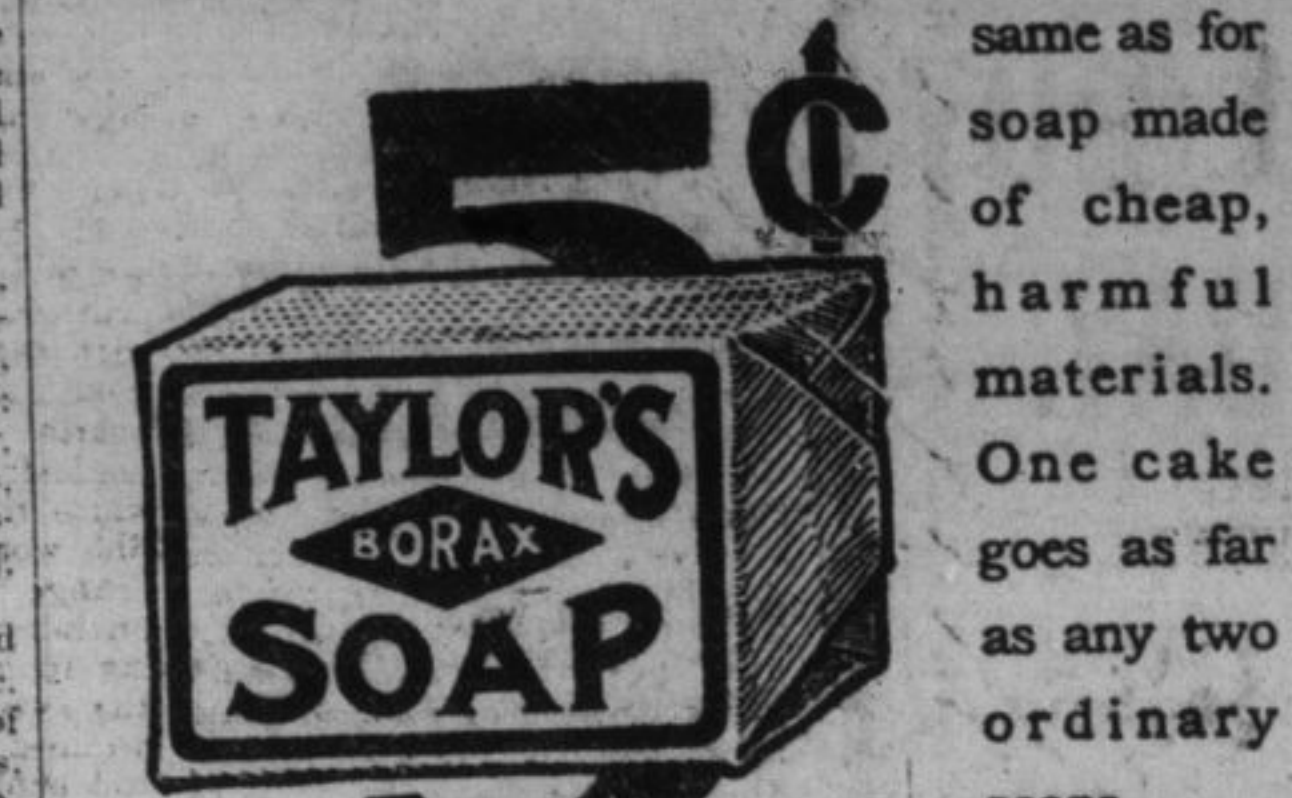

**TUB TALK No. 3**  
To wash fine lace curtains, first brush out as much dust as possible with a soft whisk broom. Then baste each curtain carefully upon an old piece of muslin a little larger in size than the curtains, tacking each scallop firmly in place. Make a strong suds with Taylor's Borax Soap and warm water, and let the curtain soak in this for about half an hour. Then squeeze gently with the hand until clean; (do not rub) rinse, starch and spread perfectly straight on the floor or other smooth surface, fastening the muslin down firmly with small brads.
