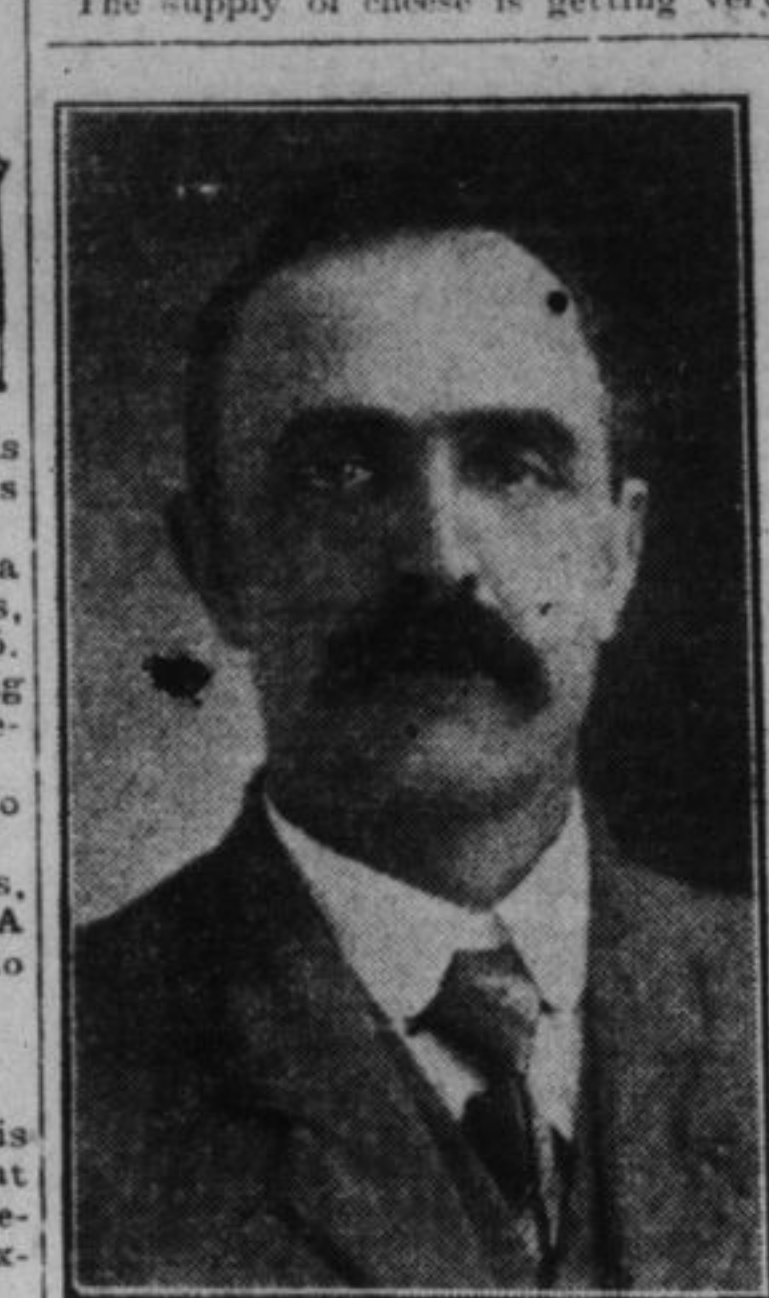

Prices Did Not Go Quite So High As Last Year, But Milk Supply Was Ample-The Officers and Members of the Board.

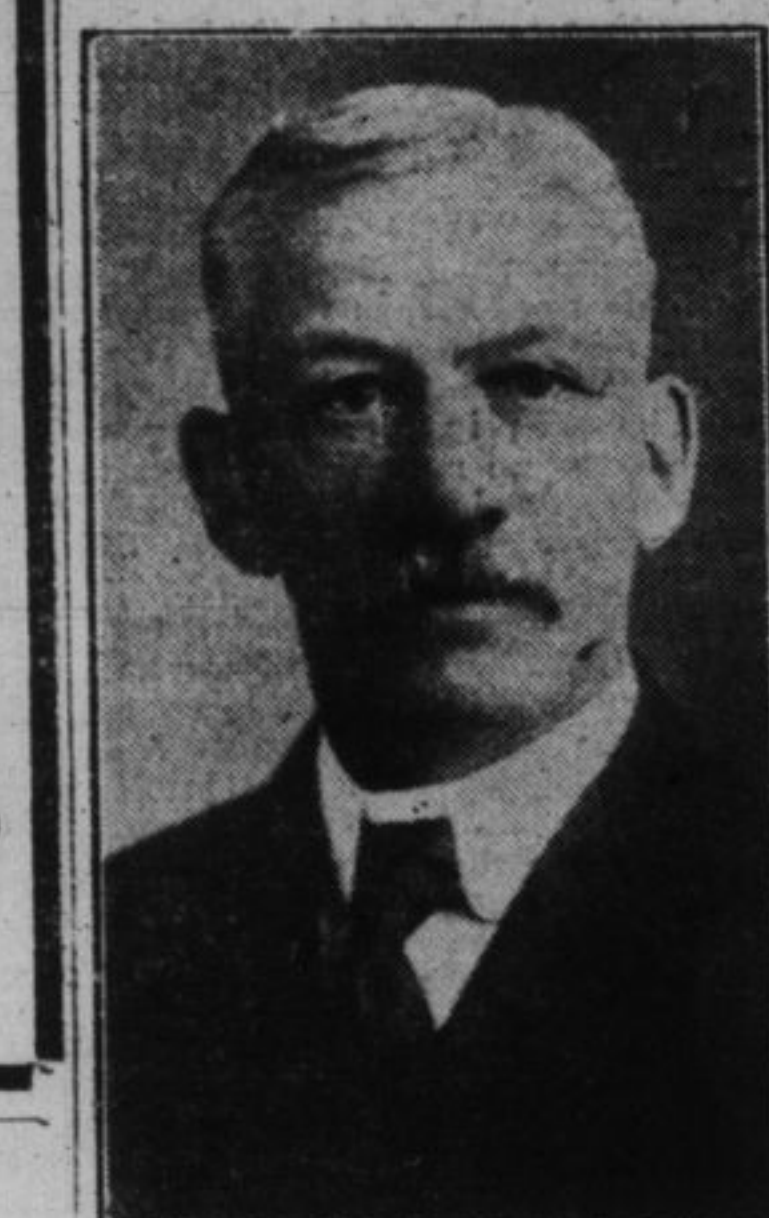


FREDERICK VALLEAN, President of Frontenac Cheese Board.
