JOBBS SUIT RICH MEN

WHAT SOME HIGH POSITIONS COST TO HOLD.

Ambassadors and Lord Mayors Must Have Wealth—Contested Election in England Cost Dollar a Vote.

London, Nov. 9.—Borchester house, the residence of Whiteley Reid during his residence in London as American ambassador is one of the finest residences in the world, and its rent is proportionately its splendor.

The figure is 4,500 guineas a year, or nearly half as much again as the official salary of Mr. Reid's post, which is only \$2,500 a year. He has also taken a very fine country house, West Park, in Bedfordshire, and his splendid weekend parties must run him into a vast expenditure.

No American ambassador to the court of St. James can keep up his position upon an income of less than \$75,000 a year, and this only by paying less than half the rent paid for Borchester house. Consequently it is impossible for any man who is not extremely wealthy to accept such a position as that which Joseph Choate, John Hay and Whiteley Reid have filled.

Our representation in Paris receives \$3,000, and at Constantinople, \$5,000. The salaries of our ambassadors to Austria, Germany and Russia are the same, but he who goes to Washington only gets \$5,000, and, he too, must be a wealthy man. However, in addition to their salaries, all our ambassadors have rent free, \$1,000 worth of subsidies belong to us, and at St. Petersburg, where we have no house of our own, there is an allowance of \$2,000 a year for rent.

BIG FIRE AT STOCCO.

J. J. McCann's Place Burned—Occupants Narrow Escape. Stocco, Nov. 8.—The store occupied by J. J. McCann as a general store was burned down on the night of Friday, 5th inst. The fire occurred between twelve and one o'clock, on Saturday morning. The store building and outbuildings were totally destroyed together with a house occupied by Benjamin Badgely, as a dwelling. Mr. McCann lost his entire stock of goods, nothing whatever being saved.

Mrs. McCann and a young girl, who were sleeping upstairs, barely escaped with their lives. Had not the presence of smoke in the room awakened Mrs. McCann, they would certainly have fallen victims to the devouring element, which swept the building within a few minutes afterwards.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the applicable Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties.—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by
