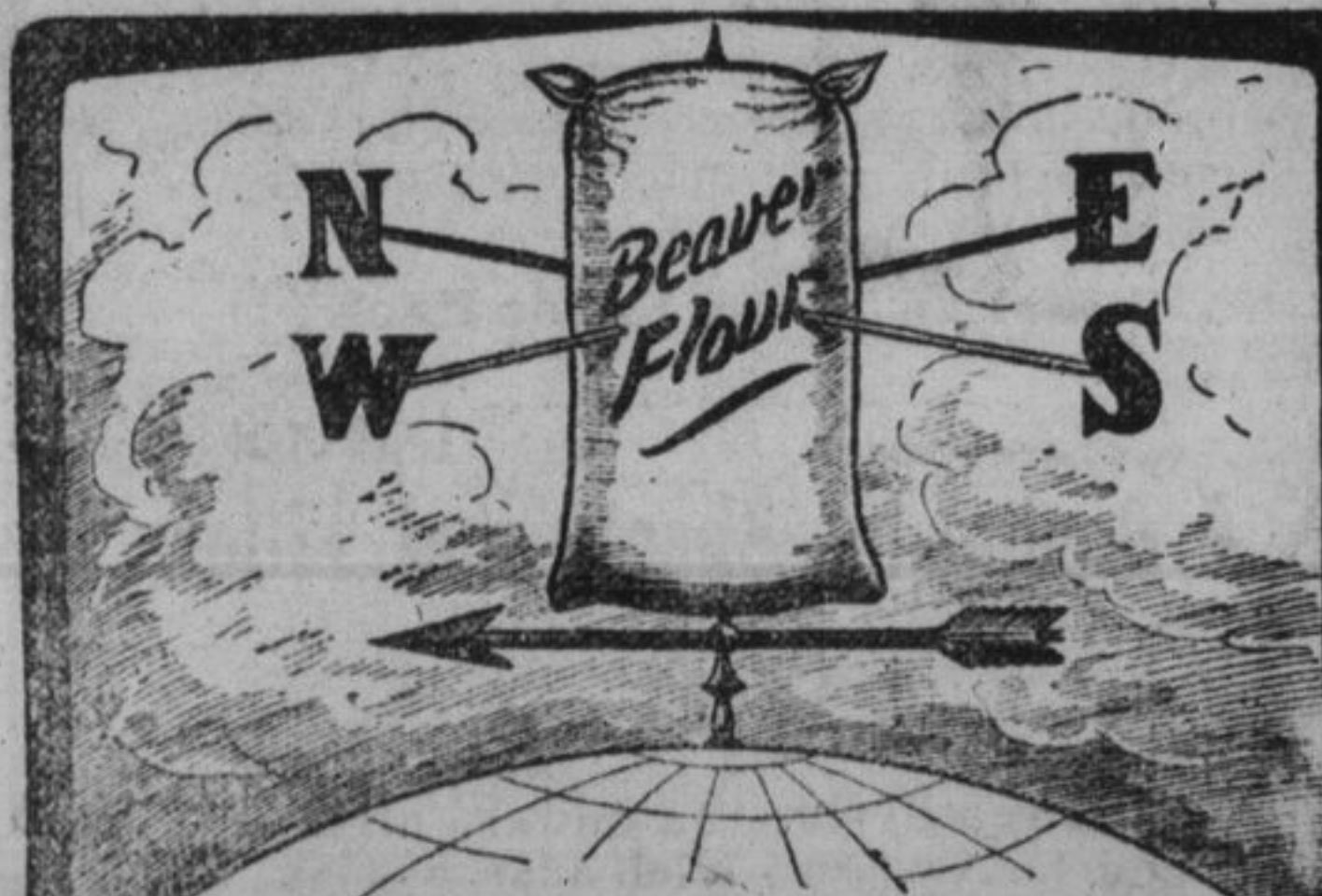

## HORRORS OF SIBERIA

TO BE KNOWN NO MORE TO RUSSIAN PRISONERS.

Hard Labor in the Mines and Life-long Exile to be Abolished—Houses of Correction to be Established in Chief Russian Towns.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 9.—It is stated that there is to be an end, shortly, of the horrors of Siberian exile. According to the proposition of the Minister of Justice, hard labor in the mines and lifelong exile are to be abolished. These penalties will be struck out of the penal code. Houses of correction are to be created in the chief Russian towns instead. The idea is that more colonists will be attracted to Siberia, and that there will be greater extension of Russian and foreign enterprise there if the odium attaching to the place of exile of myriads of Russians is removed.

## A Related Conscience.

London, Nov. 9.—An ex-graduate of Cambridge, in an advertisement in a Cambridge paper, states that one day in 1852 he came into collision on college premises with a tobaccoist's boy, and broke some pipes which he was carrying. The undergraduate, now advanced in years, runs the advertisement, "to his conscience oppressed by the fact that he never, in any way, made good the damage done, either to the boy or to his employer." If the boy is still alive he would be glad to hear from him.

## Organ Played by Handel.

London, Nov. 9.—The organ of the Moravian church, Haverfordwest, was once played by Handel, the famous composer. The instrument has remained in the same position in the church during the last hundred years. It originally came from Liverpool.

## War On Lovers.

London, Nov. 9.—The Coventry women's trustees were informed yesterday that a liberal use of tar on oars and posts, had failed to prevent lovers using certain walks, and it was decided to erect gates in order to keep them out of the trustees' estate.

## Burglar's Ruse.

London, Nov. 9.—A burglar was stated at the Enfield police court yesterday to have entered an empty house and bored a hole through a wall into an adjoining house that was occupied.

## Princess' Needlework For Poor.

London, Nov. 9.—The princess of Wales, who is patroness of the Essex Needlework Guild, has sent a number of garments made by herself for distribution by the guild.

## Mother-Horn In Orchestra.

Vietna, Nov. 9.—A mother-horn is to be used by the orchestra of the Vienna Philharmonic Society in a new symphony by Gustav Mahler.

## HEADS OR TAXES?

Sultan's Grim Humor With the Kaid.

Fez, Nov. 9.—Muhai Haid, sultan and sheriff, is gifted with a grim humor that keeps his courtiers trembling on the razor-edge of expectancy. His latest victim is the Kaid of Larache, who has been on a visit to his majesty. Certain of his position on the coast and uncertain of his sovereign, the Kaid of Larache had, heretofore, refused all invitations to pay the respect to the new sultan in Fez. What caused him to relent is not known, but he came, and with him came a peace-offering of \$5,000, and a bale of silk.

Muhai Haid gave orders that his visitor should be lodged sumptuously and fed at his own table. Each night the Kaid of Larache was convinced that he had won the confidence and affection of his sovereign, and boasted to his companions that he had never been asked to give an account of the revenues of his office.

At last, the day came when the Kaid of Larache decided to return to his home. The caravan was accordingly prepared, and the kaid went to the palace to take leave of the sultan. His majesty condescended with the kaid for "having to return to an office so unprofitable that it has ceased to yield any revenue," and warmly congratulated him on "his devotion in offering his own head in place of the missing revenue."

There would be, added the sultan, a donation of dollars or of heads at dawn next day.

Eighteen males laden with \$100,000 have just arrived from Larache, and the kaid of that port is talking of the risk that attends on the friendship of kings.

## Survived Seventeen Wounds.

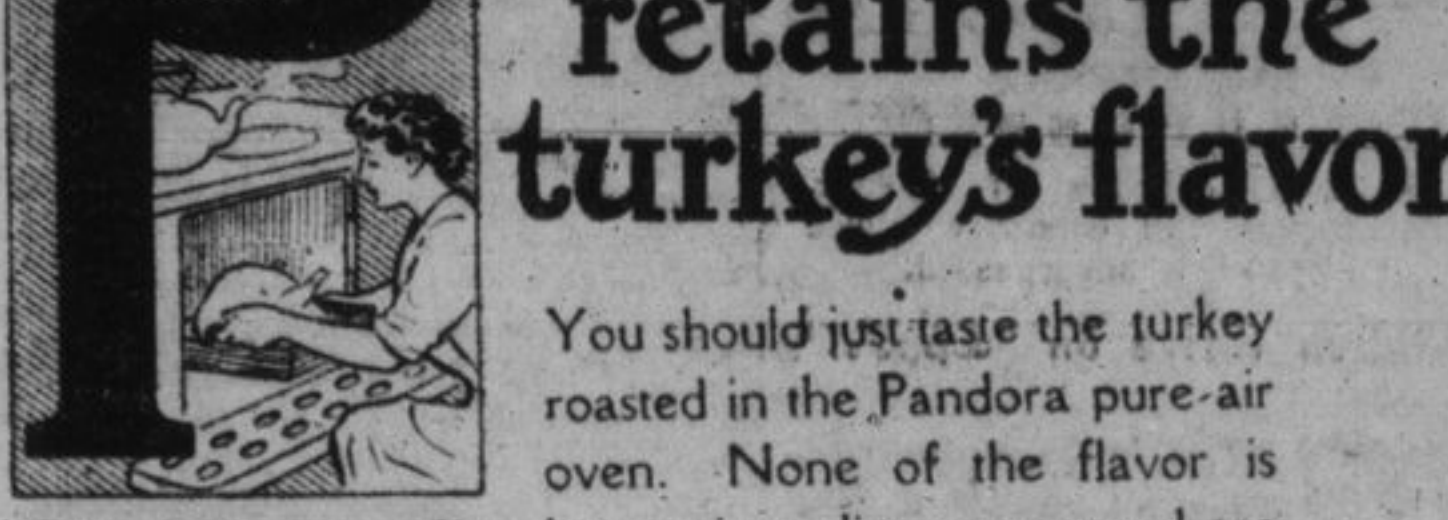
