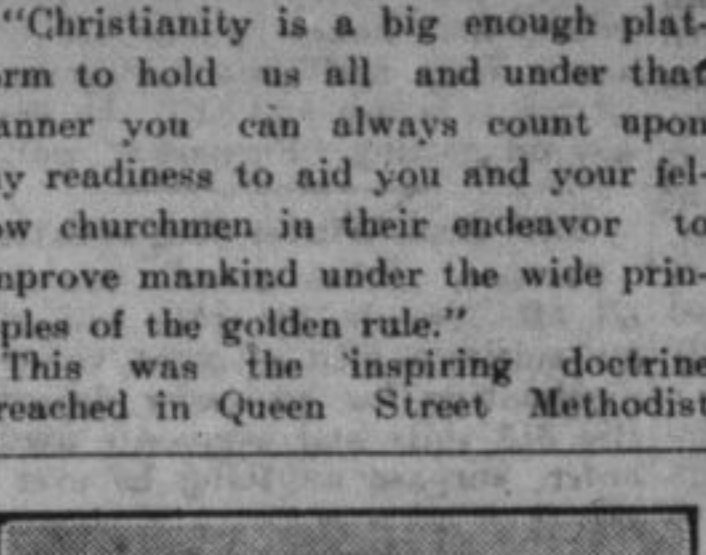
MARRIED AT OTTAWA
