THIRTY-ONE TO NINE

WAS HOW QUEEN'S BEAT OTTAWA COLLEGE

Elliott Had to Retire Before Half Time—Dickson Chastised Chartrand For Charging Him and Was Ruled Off.

Queen's easily disposed of Ottawa College in the intercollegiate rugby matches at the university athletic grounds on Saturday afternoon, winning by 31 to 9. Had Elliott, Queen's outside wing, not been forced to retire before half time the score would have been much larger. Elliott had a bad arm and knee, but played a great game while he lasted. Dickson replaced him and made the most sensational performance of the afternoon in the third quarter when he caught the ball from a long kick and punched Chartrand, one of Ottawa's halves, as he charged him, without giving him required yards. Chartrand was knocked off his pins by the punch he received between the eyes and arose in a dazed condition amid great laughter. The thing was so open and so quickly done that it was taken in good part by everybody but the referee, who couldn't see the funny side of it, and sent Dickson off for ten minutes, and at the same time penalized Ottawa for Chartrand's violation. McLeish, of Queen's, and Dubois, of Ottawa, both scrimmagers, retired through injuries in the last quarter, and were replaced by Kinsella and Lacey respectively.

Till three quarter time the game was all Queen's, the Presbyterians line breaking through Ottawa continually, while the kicking of Williams, the running of Campbell and the bucking of Moxley made the visitors look like intermediates. At quarter time Queen's led by 16 to 0 and it looked as if the locals were good for 100. In the second quarter Ottawa got a touch, while Queen's score was only seven. In the third quarter Queen's scored eight to Ottawa's nothing. In the last quarter it was all Ottawa, the visitors keeping the play right down in Queen's territory and scoring four points to Queen's nothing. Queen's had the game won and didn't seem to care about exerting themselves. However, Ottawa's line was playing aggressively, and Quilty and Chartrand were sending the ball to Queen's line repeatedly, making "Marty" Walsh very uneasy, as he had been a tennant that Queen's would triple Ottawa's score, and he won it by the narrow margin.

Quarter-Back Moxley was responsible for about half of Queen's score, as he made two touches and passed short to Campbell at Ottawa's line for another. McKay and Smith also made touches. Only one of the five was converted, Queen's being weak in place-kicking. Williams kicked for four singles and Lacey for one.

Contra made Ottawa's touch-down on a buck over. Gilligan and Chartrand each kicked a goal.

Long kick by Quilty to Queen's line. Dickson was carried over for a safety.

The day was fine for the game, there being only a breath of a breeze. About a thousand spectators were present. The teams:

Ottawa College—Contra, full back; Company, Quilty, Chartrand, halves; Muzante, quarter; Loftus, Dubois, Kennedy, scrimmager; Pitou, Fould, inside wings; Smith, Greer, middle wings; Gilligan, Belanger, outside wings.

Queen's—Williams, full back; Moran, Lacey, Campbell, halves; Moxley, quarter; McLeish, Oviend, Clarke, scrimmager; Lloyd, Gallagher, inside wings; McKay, Erskine, middle wings; Smith, Elliott, outside wings.

Referee, Dr. Etherington, Queen's; umpire, George Richardson, Kingston.

Saturday's Rugby Scores.

Hamilton Tigers defeated Toronto Argonauts on Saturday afternoon by 14 to 4. Next Saturday they meet Ottawas for the interprovincial championship.

McGill beat Varsity in Montreal by 11 to 9, but Varsity's star centre half-back, Gall, was not playing.

Yale defeated Princeton by 17 to 0 at New Haven.

Parkdale won the senior O.R.F.U. game at Toronto from Peterboro by 10 to 9.

Queen's Was Second.

In the Intercollegiate Harrier Race at Montreal, on Saturday, Varsity was first, Queen's second, and McGill third. The distance was seventeen miles. Owing to a misunderstanding, Queen's sent only four men and this militated against their chances. Watts, of Toronto, was the first man home, in 41 minutes, 49 seconds.

Ottawa Collegiate Won.

On Saturday afternoon the Kingston collegiate team was defeated at the university athletic grounds, 7 points to 5, by the Ottawa team. This is the first time in six games with Ottawa that the local collegiate boys have been defeated. The game in Ottawa about a month ago resulted in a tie, each team securing five points. The game was very close, and the large crowd present were greatly pleased with the way the youngsters played ball. The locals may try to arrange another game in Ottawa.

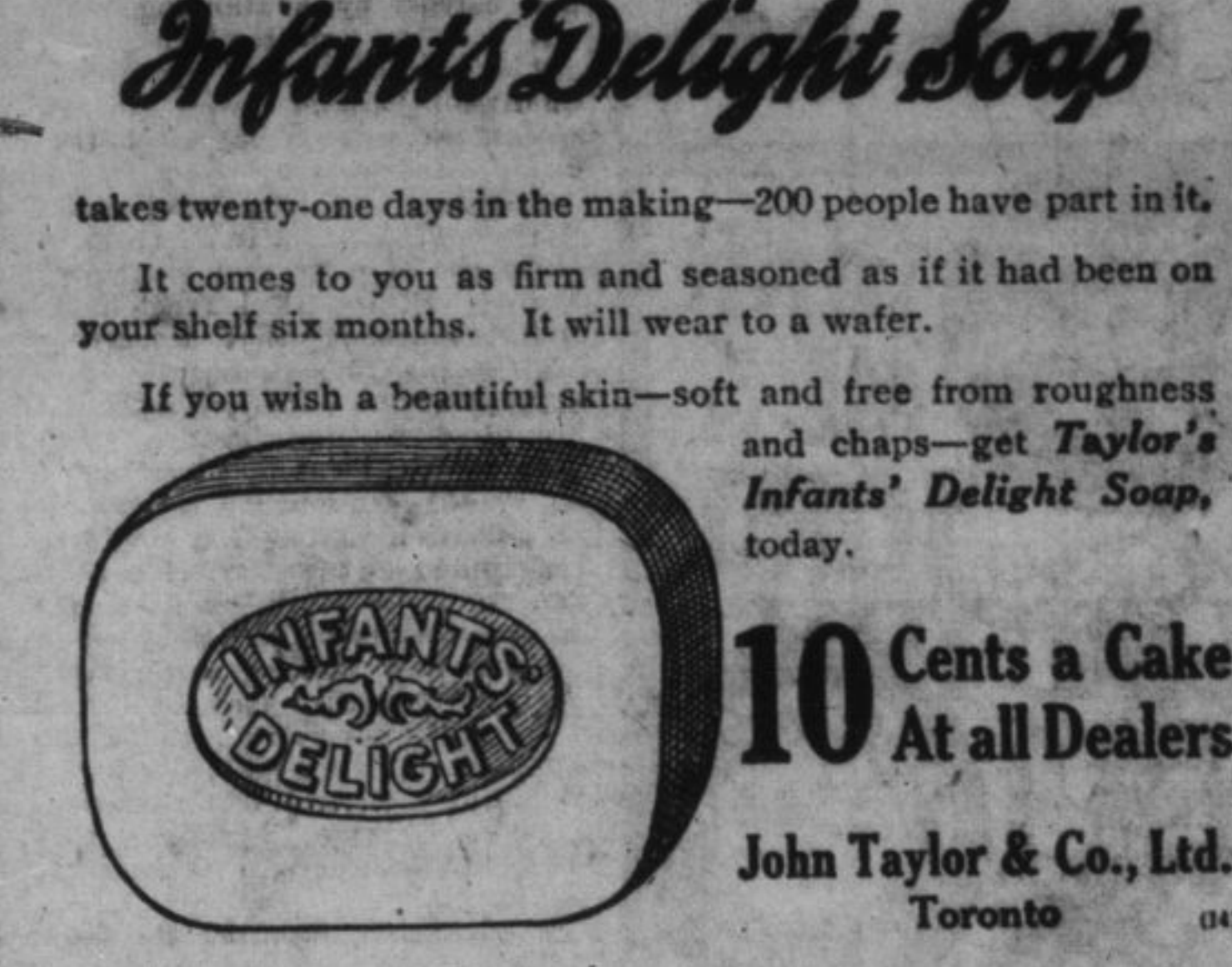
