CITY COUNCIL DOINGS
SESSION LASTED UNTIL NEAR MIDNIGHT.

Discussion on the Fire Department—Three Money By-Laws to Be Submitted to the People.
The city council sat till a quarter of twelve o'clock, last night, over two hours being taken up with the liquor license reduction and street railway power question. By a vote of 16 to 3, the council decided against a referendum on license reduction, and by a vote of 13 to 6 against a straight five-year power agreement to the street railway company.

In attendance at the meeting were Mayor Couper and Alds. Angrove, Carson, Chown, Craig, Clagston, Givens, Graham, Hanley, Harry, Hoag, Kent, McCann, McCartney, McKay, Rigney, Robertson, Tweddell, Toye.
The mayor announced that he had received word from Ald. Elliott that he would be unable to be present, as he had been appraised of the death of his brother, William Elliott, in California.

The Finance Report.
The following report of the finance committee, was adopted, on motion of Alds. Givens and Chown:
That clause 2, report No. 92, be amended as follows by striking out the words "amounting to \$28,70," in the second line and adding after the word "granted" for the time that this building was occupied by the Hebrew congregation."
That notice has been received that the Bank of British North America wishes to exercise its option of renewing the present lease of the bank premises for the further period of five years from the 1st May, 1910, on the same terms.

POOR RELIEF SOCIETY
PREPARE FOR THE WORK OF THE WINTER.

The Largest Proportion of People Aided Were English Immigrants—Many Men Waste Their Money in Liquor.
The annual meeting of the Poor Relief Association was held on Monday afternoon, in the committee rooms of the city buildings, Mayor Couper presiding. There were present: Miss A. M. Machar, Mrs. John Machar, Miss Rogers, Mrs. Oberndorfer, Mrs. Richmond, Mrs. Fairlie, Mrs. Jordan, and Dean Bidwell.
Miss Machar, the secretary, presented a gratifying report, showing that the free-will offerings of the citizens were about sufficient to look after the large number of poor and destitute families, a number of which had only recently arrived in this city. The funds were not equal to meeting all the calls on them, but the energetic committee did wonderful work with it.

The president and members of the committee visited all cases and found that the families were deserving before they were helped, and in every case the assistance did much good in aiding the destitute families. The report expressed the wish that many new members would join. Thanks were extended to all who had aided during the year.
The treasurer, Miss Holt, had the following report submitted:—Ward collections, \$477.06; city grant, \$115; donations, \$27.10; total receipts, \$619.16. Expenditures—Fuel, \$440.70; provisions, \$137.90; extras, \$27.30; total expenditures, \$605.90. Surplus, \$13.26.

GIFTS FOR AN ORGANIST
Who is Leaving For England—John Aslett the Recipient.
Last Thursday the choir of Calvary Congregational church, with a few friends, met at the home of John Collins, Russell street, where the choir presented John Aslett with a handsome silver shaving set. Henry Bauer, choirmaster, made the presentation, on behalf of the choir.
Last evening a special meeting of Calvary church Young People's Society and church members was held in the church, the pastor, Rev. H. D. Whitmore, presiding. Mr. Aslett, the retiring organist, was requested to play for the evening. Mr. Whitmore, in addressing the audience, referred to the valuable services rendered the last two and a half years by Mr. Aslett, who had ever been willing to fulfil his duties as organist, or help in any way their work in the church. Mr. Gilmore, the church secretary, then read and presented Mr. Aslett with a pleasing address, after which Mr. Bennett, another of the church deacons, said Mr. Aslett was the sort of man Canada wanted, the sort Canada was waiting for, and he hoped Mr. Aslett would make up his mind to come out again after a few months' holidays.

Two Women And That Man.
Henry D. Carey, the author of "Two Women And That Man," in answering an argument on the question of wolf dogs, said: "Until recently there has been no positive evidence as to the origin of the Eskimo dogs, and the foundation for the general belief that they had their origin in the wolves of these regions has been based upon their appearance, color and vocal peculiarities. The great stretch of territory north of the Hudson Bay region and Greenland contains two distinct species of wolves: the white wolf (Canis Albus) of the Arctic coast, and the gray wolf (Canis Griseus), of the Baffin grounds to the north and west of Hudson Bay. From specimens secured by Commander R. E. Peary, U. S. N., and other observation, there is no question that the present husky or wolf-dog is a hybrid of these two species. As there is much evidence of the hybridization of wolves in the wild state, it may be presumed that captured wolves were brought under subjection of the natives, and through intercourse of the various tribes a distinctive type has been established. In Mr. Carey's new play, "Two Women And That Man," two malamuts and a genuine timber wolf are used and form a great picture in the second act. At the Grand on Thursday, November 25th.

Bad Sleet Storm.
Trains coming into the city, this morning, over the Kingston & Pembroke railway, and the Bay of Quinte railroad, were coated with ice showing that there had been a severe sleet storm. East of Sharbot Lake, the storm appears to have been the worst and delayed trains. Kingston had a heavy rainstorm, but the sleet storm here was very light.
