

Morris and Bond united again and assumed office, Morris still declining a portfolio and not until two years later did he accept the portfolio of Justice, retaining it in the general election of 1904, and Juntil July, 1907, when, differences arising ane v between himself and Bond, he retired from the Ministry. Ontario's Peat Wealth.

The Department of Mines, under the direction of Dr. Haanel, has been engaged upon a series of peat fuel tests, which bid fair to solve the fuel problem in central Canada. After extensive investigations into the methods pursued in other countries, the Department procured a peat bog of about 300 acres at Alfred, some dis tance east of Ottawa, on the C.P.R. The peat here is of good quality and eight or nine feet thick. Extensive works have been installed and the manufacture of peat fuel by the airdried process has been successfully

Among the favorable points to be noted with regard to this method are the cheapness and economy of the plant. There is a minimum of apparatus, and as the peat is used the plant a good look at the man in the front follows it. By next year the sale of fuel will begin.
