STATEMENT IS FALSE

That 800 Kingston People Emigrated to United States.

In the House of Commons, at Ottawa, this afternoon, George Taylor, M.P., for Leeds, intended to ask if the government was aware that during the months ending September 30th, 1909, Kingston had lost nearly 800 of its population by emigration to the United States. The statement of this emigration figure is attributed to United States Consul VanSant.

Mr. VanSant was very much annoyed when he read the despatch from Ot tawa regarding the matter, and said how his report to Washington had f been mis-stated. The Whig was the first paper to report the emigration of settlers from the Kingston district to the United States, and Consul Van-Sant says its report was practically

He says he reported that during the first nine months of this year 110 permits for settlers' effects had been taken out at his office by people in the Kingston district, representing a radius of twenty-five miles. It was mere guess work to estimate how many people those permits represented. Possibly they didn't represent more than 250,

To-day the Whig telegraphed Hon. William Harty, M.P., at Ottawa, informing him that the statement regarding Kingston was false, and saying that United States Consul Van-Sant has denied making the report attributed to him.
