THE EX-SULTAN HAS \$3,000,000 STOWED IN A GERMAN BANK.
 And Present Ottoman Ruler Will Sue For It—Special Seal Necessary to Secure Withdrawal.
 Berlin, Nov. 25.—The Imperial Bank of Germany holds some \$3,000,000 deposited by Abdul Hamid before he was deposed, from the sultanship of Turkey, and which, according to The Frankfurter Zeitung, the present Ottoman ruler proposes to recover through a legal action.
 "It is learned here that the Imperial Bank is quite willing to surrender the money if the order from the same bears the signature of the former sultan, authenticated by the special seal adopted by him when the deposit was made. At that time, Abdul Hamid entered into a strict compact with the officers of the bank under which no withdrawals from this account were to be permitted except upon the authority of special seal.
 Apparently, the Turkish government was not aware of this deposit until recently, when a letter sent by the bank to Abdul and referring to the account fell into the hands of Mahmud Scheffet Pasha, inspector-general of the first and second and third army corps.
 The inspector forwarded the letter to Abdul along with the information that its contents had been noted. Subsequently, the royal prisoner signed an order on the bank for the money, but the signature was not accompanied with the seal, which he never had been lost.

HARTINGTON TO FIGHT Against Repeal of the Local Option By-Law.
 Hartington, Nov. 24.—In spite of the rain last night the meeting with regard to local option by-law was fairly well attended. Rev. Mr. McGuinness, pastor of the Presbyterian church, Harrowsmith, occupied the chair. He gave some useful information regarding the success of the by-law in the county of Grey, where he formerly resided. In that county he claims that it has proved of indisputable benefit. Mr. Rogers, of Escott, was called on to give his views of the by-law in the county in which he lives, and his remarks coincided with those of the first speaker. Rev. Mr. Fokes, of Harrowsmith, also vouched for the beneficial results in the township of Hartington, and gave the testimony of the most prominent merchants and business men in the surrounding villages, who claim that in no way has trade or business been lessened during the three years in which local option has been in force in the township. A discussion was held over a petition which has been presented to the council for a repeal of the by-law. A number of the names attached are not, it is claimed, bona fide signatures and it has been decided to bring the matter before the council at the next meeting of the petition. A permanent association was formed to fight the liquor traffic. The following officers were elected: President, Rev. Mr. McGuinness; secretary, Rev. Mr. Fokes; treasurer, Benjamin Campsall; first vice-president, E. M. Yorke; second vice-president, William Shillington; third vice-president, T. Bradford.
 The revival services are still meeting with marked success. A meeting for men only will probably be held next Sunday afternoon.


PAID \$1,000,000 INTO COURT.
 Chili Prepared For the Hague Decision.
 London, Nov. 25.—Iomingo Gana, Chilean Minister to Great Britain, today deposited with the Rothschilds \$1,000,000 to the order of The Hague arbitration court. This sum represents in round figures the Alsop claim of the United States against Chile, and the bankers are instructed to pay the same to the government of the United States should the decision of The Hague tribunal confirm the contention of the claimant.
 Seven boys broke into a public school at Passaic, N.J., nearly wrecked the building, and then attempted to set fire to it. When arrested for the crime the boys said they did not want to attend school, therefore did the mischief.

WOLFE ISLAND BEATEN.
 Flinton Correspondent Tells of a Large Family.
 Flinton, Nov. 24.—The boys who went west to the lumber shanties from here and Tweed are located in Sellwood, Ont. Andrew Pringle and family have moved into the woods north of Flinton. Rev. Mr. Williamson called on Charles Airheart. He has made many friends here already. The Methodist church is gaining a new footing since Mr. Williamson's ministry. Mrs. Hasler is in Napawa attending court. He is suing the Flinton council for damages for injuries sustained in falling on Flinton's broken sidewalks.
 Speaking of the seventh daughter, on Wolfe Island, many years ago Mrs. Joseph Harrison, of Big Bridge, had nine daughters. Then a son was born. They then moved to Minnesota and had several more children. Quite a number of this large family are living to-day. Mrs. Harrison was the eldest daughter of the late Agel Cook, Wolfe Island, her first children being twins, who are now seventy years old, both smart and well. Mr. Harrison prospered well in the west and died at the ripe old age of ninety-five years. Mrs. Harrison predeceased him to the grave many years ago, leaving a family of thirteen children.

BROCKVILLE'S WATER SUPPLY Making Examination to Determine Impurity.
 Brockville, Ont., Nov. 25.—An expert sanitary engineer has entered upon an examination of conditions surrounding Brockville's water supply with a view of making a report on the same. Samples taken from the river where the intake pipe is located have shown pollution, and the water is thought to have been the cause of the typhoid fever outbreak of the past summer. With a view to obtaining a remedy the services of the expert have been secured.
 The Rifian tribesmen at Nador, Morocco, appeared before Gen. Marina, governor of Melilla, and formally surrendered.
 Three cases of small-pox have been discovered in Middlesex township, Norfolk county. The cases are all quarantined.
