A VERY HIGH HONOR

CONFERRED UPON PROF. WATSON, OF QUEEN'S.

Appointed Gifford Lecturer By University of Glasgow For 1910-11—He Stands As One of the World's Greatest Philosophers.

Although the appointment has been made for some months, it may not be generally known that an honor of the very highest rank in the academic world has been paid to Prof. John Watson, vice-principal of Queen's University, in his having been appointed Gifford lecturer by the university of Glasgow for 1910-11. In 1877, by the princely bequest of £30,000, by Lord Gifford, four Giffordships were established in the four Scottish universities, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Aberdeen and St. Andrew's for promoting teaching and diffusing the study of natural theology. Scholars in the foremost ranks in philosophy and theology have successively held these honored lectureships. The appointment is a mark of the highest distinction in the scholastic world. Among the Gifford lecturers of Glasgow University have been Prof. Max Muller, Principal Caird, Edward Caird, and last year A. C. Bradley. Only on two occasions has the honor been bestowed on scholars on this side of the Atlantic, and never before in Canada. Of course, Prof. Watson has long enjoyed a world-wide reputation as a writer and teacher of philosophical subjects. In Canada there have been two names in the very first rank in the department of philosophy—George Paxton Young and John Watson. Such books as his "Christianity and Idealism" and the more recent "Philosophical Basis of Religion," have proven Prof. Watson eminently well qualified to be made Gifford lecturer, on the subject of "Natural Theology." It is, privately announced that Prof. Watson's subject will be "The Development of Christian Theology." The first series of lectures, to be delivered in October, 1910, will deal with the historical development of the Hebrew and Greek religions, and their culmination in Christianity, while the second series will present a reconstruction of Christian theology. Provision is, of course, made for the publication of these lectures, so that Dr. Watson's many friends and admirers may look forward to a new volume on this most interesting subject. The coming of the Gifford lectureship to Canada is a matter of national congratulation and Queen's is particularly proud that her long-revered professor of moral philosophy has been the first Canadian recipient of this high honor.

Prisoners Dug Tunnel.
Gambou, Oaxaca, Mexico, Nov. 29.—It was discovered that twenty-six prisoners in the penitentiary at Tehuantepec, many of them murderers, had escaped by digging beneath the prison walls. The structure was erected in 1850, and the tunneling of the prisoners caused the crumbling walls to fall.

President Zelaya, Nicaragua, has ordered the execution of every foreigner captured among the revolutionists. Greytown, blanketed by the insurgents, is suffering from lack of food. The government troops there are starving.

Consul Calder, Managua, has been imprisoned by Zelaya forces.
