made at any agency, on certain condi-tions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending home-Duties.-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land 'in each of three years: A homesteader may live

within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or ais-LOAN AND INVESTMENT SOCIETY In certain districts a homesteader good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price,

in each of three years, cultivate fifty, acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
