THE POCKET "WIRELESS" AN ITALIAN'S INVENTION.

Watch That Receives Messages Within a Radius of Thirty Miles. Paris, Dec. 18.—The Italian savant, Mge. Cerebotani, papal nuncio at Munich, is the inventor of an instrument, like a large watch, which enables a person to receive messages transmitted from "wireless" stations.

In order to do this he halts in the vicinity of an elevator point or at the foot of a tree, unrolls his bobbin of wire and fastens one end to the highest branch or any other support; the other end of the wire is fastened to the apparatus which is connected on the opposite side, with the case firmly planted into the earth. The telegraphic receiver is now complete, and all that remains to be done is to watch the movement of the single needle stimulated by the Hertzian waves of the transmission post.
