Washington, Dec. 23.—Affirming his complete confidence in Dr. Cook, Rear-Admiral W. S. Schley, retired, called upon Commander Peary to submit his proofs that he reached the North Record of the city.

The admiral believes that the same body which repudiated Cook's data should be permitted to pass upon the data submitted by Peary to the Geographic Society.

"The Danes are the best body of men in the world on Arctic matters," he said. *The consistory of the University of Copenhagen should be given the opportunity to examine the Peary proofs, for in that way they would be submitted to the same test that was applied to those of Cook. The consistory, which was regarded by the civilized world as more than friendly, showed by its action in turning down the explorer that it holds the scales of justice, as it sees them, evenly and
