This news was not very welcome to the number of supporters of both teams who were anxious to see the first game and see the league get along with a snap, but still the mix-up could not be avoided, and the league will go along just the same. The postponed game will be played some evening in the near future.
 The Royals had a fine practice from eight to nine o'clock, all the team being out. The Royals have a very strong team this season, and bid fair to hold the cup won last year. The following players were picked for Thursday's game: Kennedy, goal; Cherry, point; Lemmon, cover; H. Ainslie, rover; B. Muckler, centre; G. Charles, left wing; M. Ainslie, right wing.

Curling Schedule Drawn.
 T. M. Asselstine, represented the local curling club at a meeting of the Eastern Ontario Curling Association, held in Napanee, on Thursday afternoon. Dr. Cartwright represented Napanee and Peter Foran was Belleville's delegate. The schedule was drawn up for the first round of the junior series, and if necessary another round will be played. The dates were so arranged that the junior and senior teams would both be away together. It was also decided that every member of the winning team could receive a sterling silver shield. The following schedule was drawn up: On January 12th, the four teams of 1st, two teams from Napanee and two from Belleville will play in Napanee.
