## AFFIRMED THE AWARD

DECISION IN NASH CASE AT ROCHESTER, N.Y.  
Action Was Brought Against Thousand Island Steamship Co. and Related to Privileges on the Defendant's Boats.

Among the decisions filed by the appellate division of supreme court, at Rochester, N.Y., on Tuesday, was one affirming with costs the judgment and order in the case of Philip I. Nash and another, respondents, against Thousand Island Steamboat Company and another, appellants. The decision favors the plaintiff, from a judgment in whose favor the appeal was taken by the steamboat company. The decision was based upon the opinion of the appellate division on a former appeal in the same case. All concurred. Mr. Nash sued on a contract giving him the privilege to conduct a sale stand for souvenirs, etc., upon the defendant's steamers. The suit was brought for damages resulting from a steamer in the Folger fleet being kept out of commission during an entire season. Kellogg & Reeves, of Watertown, who appeared for Mr. Nash, argued that the absence of the vessel cut down the receipts of their client. The case was first tried before Justice Watson M. Rogers, who awarded plaintiff six cents, holding that he had not proved damages. The plaintiff appealed, and the decision was reversed on the ground that the question of damages was for the jury to decide. The second trial was had before Justice Andrews and a judgment of \$500 and costs returned. It is from this decision that the defendant appealed. The case will probably be carried to the court of appeals.

### TO INVADE U.S. WATERS.

Vessel Being Built to Fly South of the Border.  
New York, Jan. 14.—The Richelieu and Ontario Navigation company is about to do something no Canadian corporation ever attempted before, at least since our present navigation laws went into effect, according to John F. Pierce, assistant manager of the transportation department of that company, who has been attending the New England Passenger Association rate meeting. The company is going to run a steamer entirely in American waters. "American tourists make up a majority of the passenger traffic on the lines which run from Toronto all the way up through the St. Lawrence and Saguenay Rivers," said Mr. Pierce. "Of the number, New York state leads, with Pennsylvania second." We get most of our advertising matter printed in the states, and for our summer hotels we depend mostly on New York for our chefs and waiters. "Real estate and waterfront property are bringing big prices in Quebec and Montreal. About twenty years ago we bought a wharf property in Quebec, for which we paid \$50,000. We could turn it over to-morrow for \$150,000. It may be interesting to add that Montreal has obtained for \$15,000,000 harbor improvements such as have cost New York double that sum."

### Made To Disagree.

Managua, Jan. 14.—There is considerable military activity here. Five hundred men with four field pieces have left for La Laguna to oppose the advance of General Chamorro. Joaquin Pazo, Zelaya's son-in-law, has been released from jail on the payment of \$10,000, the surrender of 150,000 pesos in assigned bills. He also hands over eighteen public buildings, on which he had liens given to him by Zelaya as security for an alleged loan to the government. Pazo agrees to appear for trial whenever wanted.
