CANADIAN BANK PRIVILEGES AND FOREIGN BANK TAXES.

Accompanying are Examples of What Foreign Banks Pay to Their Respective States for the Exercise of the Privileges of Issuing Currency and Doing General Banking.

The Imperial Bank of Germany is a people's bank in addition to being a bank for other banks.

The Bank of France gives the government a loan of one hundred and eighty millions francs without interest.

In Italy, the Bank of Italy, Naples and Sicily, pay annual taxes on note circulation of over two millions dollars.

Austria-Hungary places a heavy tax on the bank circulation, and the government claims all the earnings over seven per cent.

The Republic of Bolivia taxes the banks one per cent. of the entire earnings without deduction for losses or cost of operation.

The banks of Roumania return to the state all discount charges over seven per cent. and 20 per cent. of the net profits over six per cent.

United States banks pay direct tax of half of one per cent. per annum on amount of daily note circulation.
