### OCCURRENCES RECOUNTED IN BRIEF FORM.

Matters That Interest Everybody—Notes From All Over—Little of Everything Easily Read and Remembered.

Ontario paid over \$18,000 in wolf bounties last year. Sir George Dunnington has suffered a relapse and his condition is serious. Detroit United directors have agreed to forego dividends for another year. Mrs. Lucy Hamilton, Hesper, committed suicide by throwing herself into a cistern. The Toronto Board of Education is being bombarded by more requests for salary increases. The Winnipeg Grain Exchange locked out the three telegraph companies doing business in Winnipeg. The death rate for Toronto in January was higher during the year than during the same month last year. High Secretary W. C. Fitzgerald, of the Woodmen of the World, is said to be about \$20,000 short in his accounts. Ten miners were killed in an explosion in a mine at Drakesboro, Ky. Seventeen others probably met death also. Only three elections are yet to be heard in Britain, in Orkney and Shetland and for the two seats belonging to the Scottish universities.
