

NO TROUBLE FROM MILK.

No Contamination. Dr. Williamson, the medical health officer, says there seems to be an idea that some of the typhoid cases have been caused by the milk supply. investigations have proven this to not be so. The milk used by every household in which typeoid has developed, has been examined bacteriologically, and found to be free from contamination. His investigation did not stop there. The well water used by every dairy which supplied milk to typhoid patients was placed under bacteriological examination also, and all sources of water supply were found satisfactory. Injected milk is certainly a typhoid originator, but the health officer blames the city drinking water for the present outbreak. Water was the only thing common to all ases, as some never touch milk.
