UNFOUNDED CHARGE

AGAINST YOUNG MAN OF STEALING A WATCH.

A Young Lad Before Police Magistrate for Drunkenness—Gananoque Tigers Defeated Wormwith Hockey Team in Extra Time.

Gananoque, Feb. 21.—In the police court, William Kane, a former resident of Seely's Bay, was arraigned, charged by a female resident of the town with the theft of a watch belonging to Miss Irene Lalonde, of Brockville. Miss Lalonde was called at witness in the case and stated under oath that no watch had been stolen from her, showing hers in court. Kane was in consequence, honorably acquitted.

Another interesting case to which there will likely be further developments in the near future, also came up for consideration. A young lad named Robert Latimer, under the age limit, appeared on a charge of being drunk and disorderly. When asked where he got his liquor he implicated two other young lads, also under age, as furnishing the liquor to him. They in turn have implicated a local hotelman, and investigation of the matter is being made, judgment in the case having been reserved for one week.

Miss Sarah Lindsay, Leeds township, residing at Lindsay's Point, a short distance west of the town, is confined to her home from the effects of serious injury received recently by a fall on the icy pavement in town, one of her arms being broken, and she being otherwise badly shaken up.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for sale at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Eighty-six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.00.
