CITIZENS ADVISED TO VOTE FOR THE DRY DOCK EXEMPTION BY-LAW.

The Industry Will Not Materialize If Exemption is Not Given—The Taxes Would be Too Great to Operate the Place.

All the property owners entitled to vote on the dry dock exemption by-law. It is most important that every voter interested in the welfare of Kingston, should cast his ballot in favor of the exemption measure, and do all he can in aiding its passing. A two-thirds majority vote is required. To secure that will mean a lot of work, but the board of trade has appointed an energetic committee to take up the work of canvassing. The passage of the by-law means the establishment of an industry that will mean a great deal to Kingston in years to come, and to grant exemption, is a mere trifling because, if the by-law should chance to be defeated, the city will not be a whit better off. Instead, it would lose \$300 in school taxes. Every voter, should enter heartily in the campaign, and carry the by-law.

This is Kingston's unique and vital opportunity, to inject into its commercial life, a vitality that will make it throbb with better things, and team with a new commercial life and it is firmly believed, that all will share the benefit of this fact. The men behind this great enterprise are men of the widest possible experience in shipbuilding work, and men who have been successful in life, to the extent of placing millions to their credit in the financial world, and are not coming into our midst to conduct an experiment, but to give the benefit of a long and ripe experience in their particular line of work, and they have every confidence in their ability to make the work here a stupendous success, as they started by the passage of the by-law. Seven years ago, they acquired the small dock at Collingwood, worth only a paltry \$20,000 and by getting their energy and experience into the work, they have built up an industry valued at over a million dollars. They can do even better than this for Kingston, because of the better location and opportunities presented. This shipbuilding company comes to the citizens asking for no bonus. It only asks for an exemption of taxation to the extent necessary to make it possible to operate the local dock. The assessed valuation of the property they have acquired is such as to make it possible for any man or combination of men, however experienced, to operate to a profit, or even to make it pay wages without such an exemption as they ask for in the present by-law. They will for the first year, pay wages, to the extent of \$30,000, a rental to the government of \$10,000 a year and a school tax to the extent of a valuation of \$50,000 as well as spend on the plant for the next year, the sum of \$50,000, and unless relieved of the tremendous burden, which the actual assessed valuation of the property would demand, it would be an insane undertaking for the richest corporation to assume. But, with the relief which the by-law is intended to afford, the company is confident it can succeed and give to Kingston what will eventually prove the finest dock property in the whole of Canada, and the best shipbuilding plant along the great waterways of Canada.

It is the first time in its history for the city to be approached by a reliable corporation with millions behind it, without asking for anything beyond an exemption from an impossible tax assessment, and such a reasonable demand should have the endorsement of every voter entitled to vote on the by-law of this character. Kingston rise to the present splendid commercial occasion, and secure a docking enterprise that will be a credit to the city and a financial benefit to every man and household.

ROSEBERY'S PROPOSALS For the Reforming of House of Lords.

London, March 10.—In the House of Lords, yesterday afternoon, Lord Rosebery gave notice that he intended to move on March 14th the following three resolutions:—

- 1.—That a strong and efficient second chamber is not merely an integral part of the British constitution, but is essential to the well-being of the state and the balance of Parliament;
- 2.—That a second chamber can best be obtained by reforming and reconstituting the House of Lords;
- 3.—That a necessary preliminary to such reform and reconstitution is the acceptance of the principle that possession of a peerage shall no longer in itself give the right to sit and vote in the House of Lords.

London, March 10.—The navy estimates, just issued, amount to over \$40,000,000, an increase of nearly \$5,000,000. The new construction for the year will cost \$13,279,820, against \$8,885,194 during the past year. The new programme includes five larger armoured ships, five protected cruisers, twenty torpedo boat destroyers and a number of submarines. On April 10th there will be under construction seven battleships, three armoured cruisers, nine protected cruisers, thirty-seven destroyers, and nine submarines. The estimates further provide for an increase of 3,000 men in the personnel of the navy and the completion during 1911 of two floating docks to accommodate the largest battleships. These will be stationed at Portsmouth and Medway.

Reginald McKenna, first lord of the admiralty, in an explanatory statement announces the formation of a new naval mobilization department and a permanent navy war council consisting of the first sea lord as president, the directors of the naval intelligence and navy mobilization departments and other officials to deal with all matters relating to preparation for war.

Victim's Thin Skull Saves an Accused Murderer.

Traverse City, Mich., March 10.—Because the skull of his victim was declared to have been thinner than that of the average man, Caleb Cox, a butcher, yesterday, escaped punishment for the death of Frank Hardy of this city.

Following a quarrel over an account, Cox struck Hardy, fracturing his skull. A post-mortem was held and it was decided that Hardy's skull was abnormally thin. The court yesterday found that a similar blow on a normal man's head would not have been sufficient to cause death. Cox escaped with a \$100 fine for assault.
