FINE CLEANING MACHINE.
 All Tests Have Been Found Very Satisfactory.

Harvey Miles, the up-to-date bicycle repair man on Bagot street, has added a fine vacuum cleaning machine to his equipment. The new machine is a Zimmco electric vacuum cleaner of the newest design, and in all tests has covered itself with glory. The machine is small and handy and can be taken and handled readily in churches, theatres, houses, stores, etc., to clean carpets, curtains, walls, ceilings, and in fact anything that gets dirt or microbes settle on. Four pumps, furnishing a vacuum of sixteen pounds are used, strong enough to lift a twelve pound weight from the ground. The machine was put through some rigid tests by the makers before it was accepted by the Kingston merchant and in every case proved more than was told of it. These machines are installed in the Royal Alexandra theatre and the Prince George hotel, Toronto, where they give fine satisfaction.
 Mr. Miles is now ready to take orders in any part of the city, to clean carpets, curtains, etc., without removing them. The machine also has an attachment known as a "perfumator" that can be fitted with formaldehyde, or any other substance and used for disinfecting.

BURNS CAUSE DEATH
 RELIEF CAME ONLY AFTER A NIGHT OF AGONY.
 Tragedy Near Gouverneur—Clothing Store Fire From Matches With Which She Was Playing in the Absence of Her Parents.
 Gouverneur, N.Y., March 17.—In a farm house five miles from this village a terrible tragedy was enacted that had its culmination in the death of the victim.
 David Hayden and his family reside on a farm in the vicinity of the Mud Hole cheese factory, about five miles from this village. The family consists of himself, wife and several small children.
 They arose early Wednesday morning, as was their custom, to do the milking. The father and mother were at the barn when their youngest child, Mary, a bright little girl of three years, climbed up in a chair, and reaching into a cupboard secured some matches.
 With these she was playing when one of them ignited and set her clothing on fire. Her little brother and sisters endeavored to quench the flames, which soon enveloped the child, while one of them hastened to the barn to alarm her parents. The father and mother hastened to the house, but before they could smother the blaze the child had been burned so badly that parts of her body were burned to a crisp. She lived twelve hours.

Placing Road Signs.
 At a meeting of the directors of Ontario Motor League the sum of \$500, was appropriated for the purpose of continuing the work of erecting road direction signs throughout the province. Last year signs, large number of signs were erected in different parts of the country and these have proved of considerable service to users of the country roads, particularly motorists.
 In this work the members of the league contributed including Hamilton, Kingston, Ottawa and other clubs. The Canadian Pacific and Great North Western Telegraph and Bell Telephone companies have given permission to place the signs on their poles.
 Big Engines, Little Poles.
 Two unusually fine new passenger locomotives arrived at the C. P. R. yards, to-day, en route to Buffalo, says the Toronto Star. They were constructed at Kingston, and are probably the largest turned out in Canada. Last year they were driving wheels, and exceptionally low smoke stacks, the latter being only some six inches high. Beside the yard engines, the strangers looked like veritable giants of the locomotive world.

 Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.
 ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
 Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
 In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section elsewhere his homestead. Price, \$2.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead status) and cultivate fifty acres extra.
 A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and wishes obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.
