A LOCAL ENTERPRISE

THE DRYDOCK BUSINESS WILL BE KINGSTON'S.

The Men in the Enterprise Stand High in Business—Let Every Voter go to the Polls on Monday and Vote for the By-law.

Some people who are old enough and wise enough to discriminate between the good and the bad things in commercial life have an idea that the local dry dock has been acquired for the purpose of closing it up as an actual working proposition, so that a place like Colindale might have an exclusive contract on the shipbuilding interests of this part of Canada, and this idea is being striven to put the man who lives like the turtle, shut up within himself, caring little or nothing for his fellow-men, the city in which he lives, or the future of his land and country. Now if it was the intention of the promoters of the new shipyard to merely tie up the local dry dock and prevent others from using it for the purpose of building ships and thus giving them competition, why would the new company be allowed to go to the polls and force them to hire Kingston workmen, pay \$30,000 a year in wages, put \$50,000 into plant for the first year and improve this every succeeding year, start work immediately on the passage of the by-law, arrange for the amount of \$50,000 for school tax, etc., etc., if they only intended to block the possibility of building boats in the city of Kingston? The thought is as unfair as it is absurd and no one who respects his intelligence should be caught peddling such a perjury to the detriment of Kingston and the injury of honest business men.

The taxpayer should also bear in mind that the men whose names are associated with this new shipyard have an untarnished reputation in the commercial world. They are men with clean records, who have climbed to the top of the ladder by reason of their honesty and integrity, and at this late date in life are not going to besmirch a long life of upright business dealings with a trick played on the voters of Kingston purely for their own selfish ends and purposes. In the name of all that is fair and just why should such a silly and senseless story find a single willing listener or believer in a city of Kingston's intelligence?

In the shipbuilding and operating circles of Canada there is no name better known than that of Brian Calvin and all who know him respect him for his sterling integrity and uprightness, and the very fact that he is part and parcel of the new company ought to satisfy every taxpayer that the by-law is above attack or reflection and safe to support at the polls next Monday. Others who have built up large business interests in this city outside of shipping circles are men who are known to be clean in business relations and the men who are added to these from outside places should have the confidence of every taxpayer and voter for what they are and have always been in their business spheres.

Surely it ought to be possible to inaugurate such a movement as the present shipbuilding company without the finger of unjust accusation being pointed so unfairly to those who are active in its interests, or without entertaining suspicions that are as destitute of support as they are of reason and pull together for the common good. Kingston was ever hampered by unfair criticism and unjust accusation from the vicious "knocker" and in the passage of this by-law the limestone city has the best chance it has ever had to bury this dangerous type of destroyer beyond the possibilities of a resurrection.

Kingston is going to have a shipyard if the by-law passes on Monday, and it looks as though it was destined to become the leading shipyard on the great lakes or the river St. Lawrence. All that the city needs is confidence in itself and then it will have confidence in others and this will bring the day of better things to any community. Just a few days more and the polling day will be here and Kingston should not let this shipbuilding by-law go down to defeat and disgrace, but should give it the success it deserves and support it for the best of reasons ever given for an industry seeking to do business in a fair and open way. To the clean all things are clean, and this has all the appearance of a clean proposition of unqualified support.

BOYD-GORDON MINE.

One Carload High Grade Ore Shipped, Another Ready.

The Boyd Gordon Mining Co. shipped a car of thirty-five tons very high grade ore on the 14th. The ore is loaded to the berth and ready to ship at any time. An expected carload of about four thousand ounces (2000) is ready for shipment, which will be shipped in a few days. They are bagging ore at the forty and seventy-five cent levels at the rate of from 12 to 15 cents of high grade per day. Sufficient tonnage will be shipped to last for the coming year. The mine is fully equipped with everything necessary to carry on the work to the 120 foot level, using a full force of men. The road from Gow Ganda to Gow Ganda Junction is in excellent condition and has every appearance of remaining so for some time yet.
