The cheque thus sent will be returned to the respective parties whose tenders are not accepted.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any person over 18 years of age who has been a resident of a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, and who is not a tenant, must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situated, and make application on certain conditions by letter, or in person, to the Sub-Agency or Agency of the district.

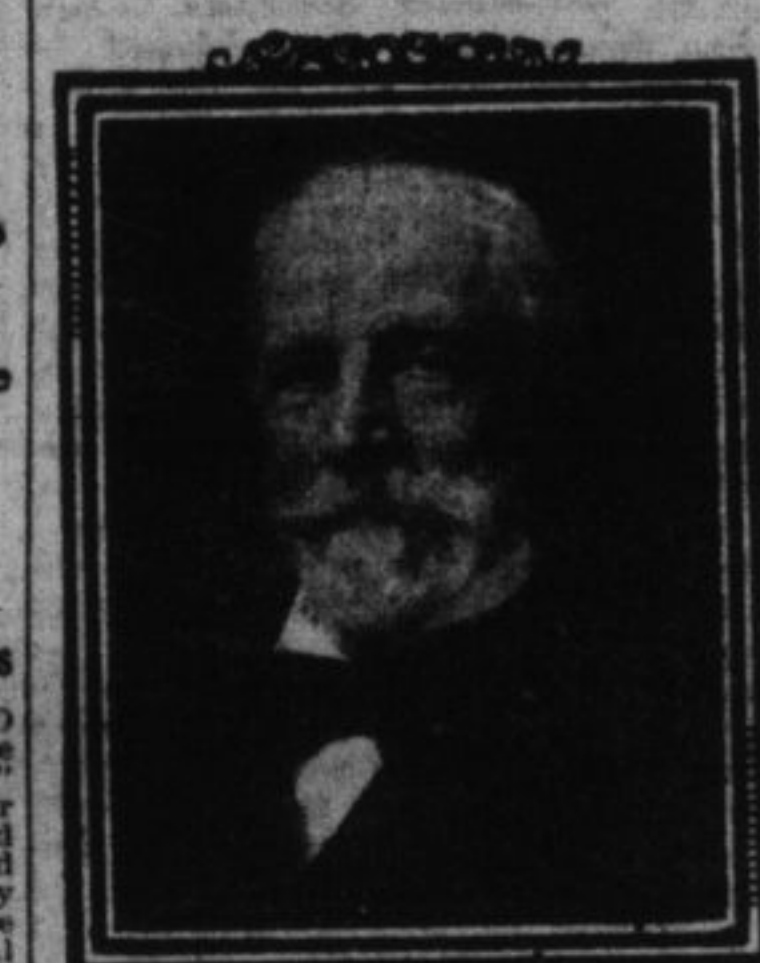
