FINED IN GANANOQUE

FOR UNLAWFULLY OPENING MUSKRAT HOUSES.

Grace Church Anniversary Day—Collection Yielded \$908—Ice in the St. Lawrence is Gradually Breaking Up.

Gananoque, March 21.—The seventy-fourth anniversary of the institution of Grace Methodist church was celebrated yesterday. Rev. W. J. Wood, of Smith's Falls, a former pastor of the church, filled the pulpit at both services. The choir of which Grace church is deservingly proud, excelled themselves in their musical numbers. At the morning service \$554.66 was contributed. At the afternoon session of the Sunday school this amount was increased by \$33.93 and at the evening service a further donation amounting to \$270.00 were received, making a grand total of \$908 for the day, which, with further contributions during the week, will foot up, no doubt, to \$950. This will make the payment of \$1,000 on the debt of Grace church for this year an easy matter.

News which has excited the keenest interest throughout this section was given a hearing before Alfred Hunter, of Belleville, head of the government's game and fishery department of Eastern Ontario at the International hotel on Saturday, when J. Mr. Toner a week ago confiscated the traps, his action being upheld by Inspector Hunter, who also imposed on the accused a fine of \$25 and costs.
