For Expenditure at the Military College

LANCASTER'S VIEW

WAS ACCEPTED BY THE MINISTER OF MILITIA.

Commandant's Salary is to be Increased—Ready to Bring a Party of Members to Visit the College—Cadets are to Visit Ottawa.

Ottawa, March 22.—The House of Commons was occupied for a considerable time, yesterday afternoon, in discussing the Royal Military College. The House went into committee to consider the following resolution by Sir Frederick Borden, minister of militia:

"That it is expedient to amend the Royal Military College act, chapter 43 of the revised statutes, 1906, by repealing section 7 and substituting therefor the following:

"The salaries, pay and allowances of the commandant and of the superior and subordinate staff of the college shall be as fixed from time to time by the governor-in-council."

Sir Frederick Borden explained that the intention of the act was to leave to the governor-in-council the fixing of salaries. At the present time the salaries paid to the professors in the Royal Military College were all fixed by order-in-council with the exception of the commandant. It was proposed, also, by the resolution to withdraw the limitation as to the total amount of money to be expended on the college. There had been several amendments from time to time increasing the amount which was limited, in the first place, by act of parliament, and increased when the college had grown and the expenses had increased. It seemed to him (Sir Frederick) that instead of having to come to parliament every few years it would be better to leave the adjustment of the amount of salaries and expenses in the hands of the governor-in-council. Section 7 of the act read: "The salary of the commandant shall not exceed \$3,000 a year and the salary of the staff adjutants, professors, instructors, assistant instructors and staff shall be fixed and may be readjusted from time to time by the governor-in-council and shall not exceed the sum of \$50,000."

Mr. Lannox (conservative, Niagara and Lincoln)—Does the honorable minister propose to put unlimited power on the governor-in-council?

Sir F. Borden—I propose to give the governor-in-council power as to the salary of the commandant without any limitation just as you have in regard to the others.

Mr. Lancaster—Are you not going to put any other amount in the place of the \$30,000?

Sir F. Borden—No, I don't propose to do so. Parliament controls the amount in the estimates. During several sessions we have voted more money than the act really authorized. I consider we were justified in doing so, because parliament gave us the authority, but the auditor-general called my attention to the fact that we were exceeding the amount provided in the act, and suggested that the act should be amended. I conclude that it would be just as well to amend the act in such a way that it would not be necessary, in case the college increased, to come to parliament for an amendment of the act every time more money was needed.

Mr. Lannox—Are you to understand that the auditor-general called attention to the fact that you were exceeding the amount authorized by the act?

Sir F. Borden—Yes, but it was done with authority, parliament had voted the money.

Mr. Lannox—Does the minister know whether at the time the money was voted the attention of parliament was called to the fact?

VETO POWER

Resolutions Now Before British Parliament.

BALFOUR SEEKS TIME

NOT ANXIOUS FOR ELECTION UNTIL READY.

Possible That Asquith May Extend His Hold of Office—When Budget May Be Brought Out—Effect of Asquith's Resolutions.

London, March 22.—Premier Asquith, last night, tabled in the House of Commons, the long-promised resolutions abolishing the veto power of the lords. The resolutions are three in number and are as follows:

1. That the lords shall have no power to reject or amend a money bill as they now exist. This follows a definition of a money bill as affected by the resolutions. The second resolution asserts that it is expedient that the powers of the House of Lords respecting all bills shall be restricted so that if any such bill be passed by the commons at three successive sessions and rejected by the lords at each of these sessions it shall become a law without the consent of the lords and without the royal assent being given.

2. That the duration of parliament shall be limited to five years. The house of commons in committee of the whole, yesterday, adopted the first and second of three resolutions moved by Lord Rosebery on March 14th. The debate on the third resolution, in regard to the holding of a peerage giving an inherent right to sit and vote in the second chamber was adjourned until tomorrow.

3. That a strong and efficient second chamber is not merely an integral part of the British constitution, but is necessary to the maintenance of the state and the balance of parliament.

"That a second chamber can best be obtained by reforming and reconstructing the House of Lords."

The third resolution on which the debate was adjourned reads: "That a measure of reform and reconstruction of the principles that possession of a peerage no longer in itself give the right to sit and vote in the House of Lords."

The Chronicle is authority for the statement that the government are in sight of an agreement. It is asserted that Chancellor Lloyd-George and the chief Irish whip were in conference for two hours last night, and that the exchange of views was cordial and unreserved. There is good reason to believe, adds the Chronicle, that the government and the Irish leader will arrive at a complete understanding.

Balfour Wants Time. New York, March 22.—A Tribune cable from London says: "It is expected that the ministry will hang up the budget in committee about the time when the veto resolution reaches the lords and resign if unfavorable action is taken. A. J. Balfour's refusal to take office when the supplies are exhausted is regarded as probable, and Premier Asquith's return to power may be followed by an arrangement with the unionists regarding last year's finance bill. These forecasts assume that the lords will dispose of the veto resolution whenever it suits the convenience of the ministers, and that John Redmond is beating the air when he shouts, 'No veto, no budget!'"

It may not be true that John Burns threatened to resign office unless some measures were adopted for straightening out the financial situation, and that several of his colleagues were in sympathy with him, but it cannot be doubted that Mr. Redmond insists on royal guarantees as the price of the nationalist support of the budget, and that the radical members are exasperated by his unconciliatory conduct, that the nonconformists are in a state of revolt, and that the coalition funds are undermining the position of the government.

The reform of the upper chamber, either on tory or radical lines, will be the main question at the next election. While all signs point to a general election during the spring, the unionists in parliament admit that they are not prepared for it, and are anxious to defer the crisis as long as possible. Mr. Balfour's friends report that he will prefer to have the elections come in October or January, when the party can confidently expect to gain as many as a hundred seats. While the radicals are disappointed, they are convinced that their losses will be less serious if a fighting policy be adopted and the battle be fought speedily.
