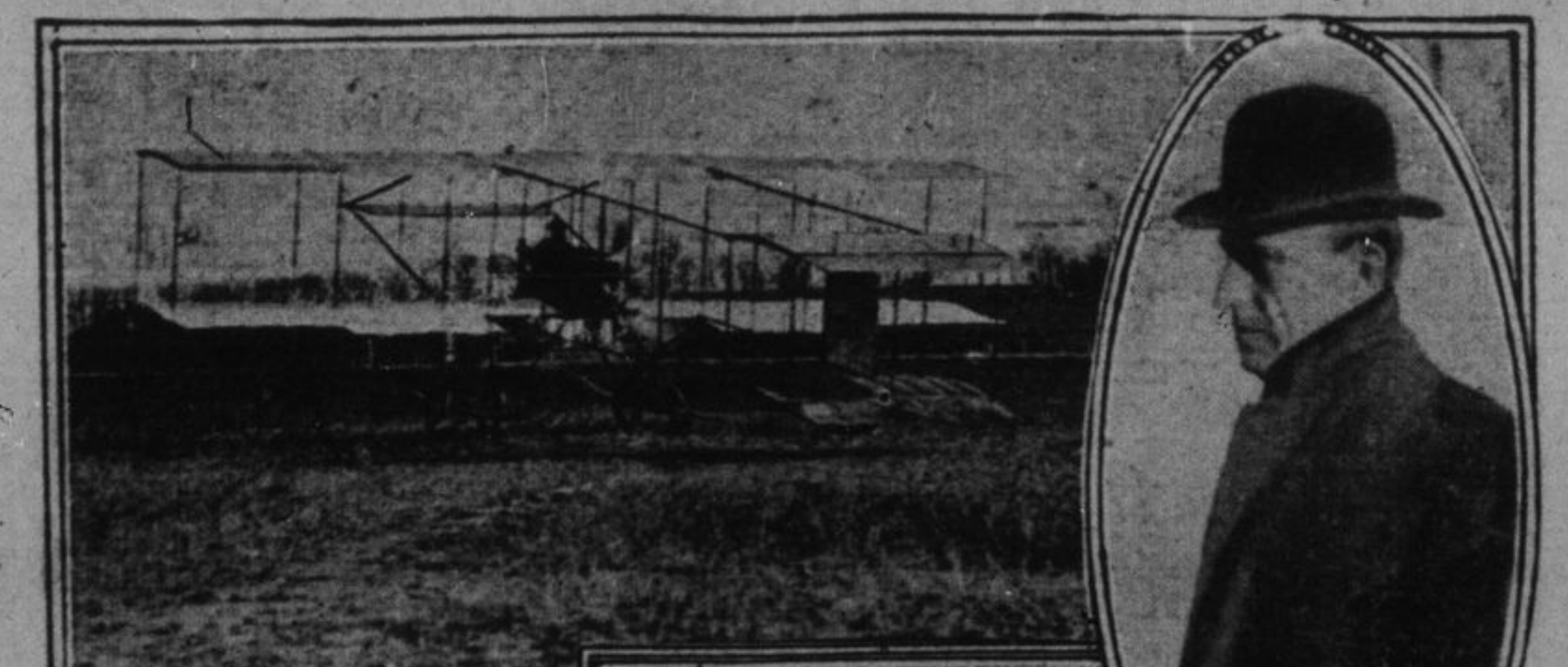

DELIGHTED AND ASTONISHED WATCHERS



MONS. PAULHAM LEAVES THE GROUND AT TAMMARA, RACE COURSE.

New York, March 21.—In two successful flights, Louis Paulham, the daring French aviator, who has delighted and astounded the watchers on every hill and promontory near the Jamaica race track, Long Island. He was cheered from all sides as with easy grace he first sent his biplane up to a height of 600 feet, easily circling in the radius of the race track at the rate of thirty to thirty-five miles an hour, and then in a second flight he went to a height estimated at 1,000 feet.



Scientists, newspapermen and photographers numbering 300, were gathered in the track enclosure, but thousands were scattered over the suplit landscape and these added their cheers to those of the invited spectators when the "manbird" began gliding swiftly around a thousand feet in the air. The afternoon sunshine was reflected from his yellow oilekin costume and at times he circled around in a streak of flashing ochre.

SMOKING GOOD, HE SAYS. Doctor Finds It Preventive of Spinal Troubles.

Paris, March 22.—After all the abuse which has been hurled at the practice of tobacco smoking it is refreshing to find a medical man asserting that he has discovered, and can prove by statistics, that smoking is good for the health. "Smokers," he says, "are almost immune from meningitis." Dr. de Kermabon, of the French army, is the author of the new theory. He has patiently gathered statistics and watched the ravages of the cerebro-spinal disease among the young recruits of the French army, and as their habits, among other things, that of smoking, are carefully noted in the reports, he was astonished to see that so few of the habitual smokers were attacked by the disease. The proportion, as established by him, is one to twenty, that is to say, for one case of meningitis among a given number of smokers there are twenty cases of the disease among an equal number of non-smokers.

HUGO AND THE BARBER. When Victor Hugo lived in Paris in the Place Royale he used to be shaved by a barber named Brassier.

There are the platform, the ladder and the triangular knife with which the celebrated executioner, Balducci, who beheaded Toquetti and Monti, and exercised his dreadful functions until the liberation of Rome.

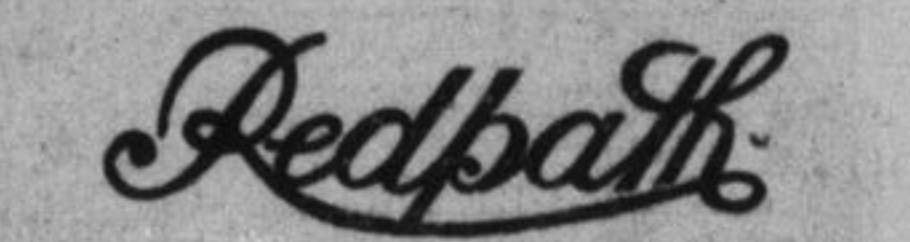
