FACTORY EMPLOYEE MET WITH SEVERE INJURY.

Gananoque, March 29.—Francis Amo, Garden street, met with severe injuries while operating a machine in one of the local factories yesterday. He had his left wrist badly cut by the breaking of a belt, throwing the arm almost the sharp blade of a pulley. The artery was cut near the wrist and he bled profusely until a tight bandage applied above the artery stopped the flow.

NAPOLEON'S CABIN BOY Is in an Australian Charitable Institution.

There is a woman in a Sydney, New South Wales, institution presided over by the French sisters of the Little Company of Mary, who will be 106 shortly. He is William Johnston and in 1815 he was cabin boy on H.M.S. Northumberland, the British warship that took Napoleon to St. Helena. For a time afterwards he remained on the island as one of the personal attendants of the fallen emperor.

His story has been sited by the sisters and less unworlily folk, and they have no doubt that it is genuine. It is certain, at any rate, that a William Johnston was a cabin boy on the Northumberland when Napoleon took that memorable journey.

Johnstone loves to tell anecdotes of the emperor, and, of course, never lacks listeners. He generally begins: "I was cabin boy under St. Helena, and I used to look after the emperor's cabin. We used to have many talks and I think he got rather fond of me."

When the play "A Royal Divorce" came to Sydney Johnston was taken to see it and thoroughly approved of it. He said the man who played the part of Napoleon was just like him—same stand, same walk, same face and he had a mark on his neck like Napoleon's.

Jothan P. Aids, a New York state senator, was branded as a bribe-taker by his colleagues at Albany, but resigned before the vote was taken. The anti-fox hunting movement is getting considerable prominence during the last ten days in England.
