It is claimed that by this process he production of radium will be luced from nine months to six seven weeks, and the British Radium Corporation has been formed for taking over the radium rights of the rentwith mine at St. Ives, where the iscovery of pitchblende ore was made (previously referred to in aconular and trade reports.) The services of Sir William Ramsay have been retained by the corporation.

The total quantity of radium which has thus far been recovered for scientific use throughout the world is estimated not to exceed one-fourth of bound. The total stock in the London hospital is but about sixteen and one-quarter milligrams.

A little while ago the pitchblende containing this wonderful element was actually regarded as a nuisance by he old miners of St. Ives; so that it was cast aside on the rubbish hean which grew to mountainous proportions, and from which to-day the company is obtaining tons of material.
