FIRST ON RECORD.

Initial Airship Guide Has Made Its Appearance.

The first airship guide on record has made its appearance. It is published at Munich, Bavaria, and bears the title of "Aerofambolism." It gives dates and hours of the airship service which is to begin on May 15th next, to last until the end of September, the first service starting from the Theresienhöhe at 7 a.m. on the first-named date. Fares are also given in detail, the standard adopted being time, not distance.

The price of a short journey of three hours is 55f if tickets are bought in advance, whereas all day trips into the Bavarian highlands or to Oberammergau will cost the equivalent of \$137.50. Persons for whom these prices are too modest may hire special air trains at £1.375 a day.

The promoters of the undertaking claim the right to alter the length and even the direction of each voyage and to set down passengers where they will. Builders are busy on the new airship station, which is situated along the track of the Munich-Vienna railroad. It will be 250 feet wide, and 83 feet high, so it will not be large enough to accommodate a Zepelin.
