

SLOWLY PREPARED DIVORCE

Between French Liberal and Ontario Tory Spirit.

The News and some of the conservative newspapers of Montreal, who hold common ground with the Toronto, paper, reproach Mr. Monk above all manoeuvre directed against Mr. Borrecognized the right of a representative to express his views freely, and we have always applauded the courparty spirit to follow the dictates of their conscience. But it is evident that the naval separated Mr. Borden from Mr. Monk, and the other members from the province of Quebec. It is a fight between different mentalities. It is the slowly prepared divorce between the French-Canadian liberal spirit and the Ontario tory spirit. These two were united in 1854 in order to make up the liberal-conservative party. But for several years past the conservatives of the province of Quebec have thought that the other members of the pact, the conservatives of Ontario, have not respected the old party conventions. And to see that they are right, it is only necessary to follow the development of the policy of the News, which is also that of Mr. Borden. Little by little the chasm has grown larger and larger until it is now so large that it will separate the liberal-conservatives and the tory-conservatives. This, in our opinion, is an explanation of the present crisis, and it may be found that it has considerable historical im-


