WATCH FOR COMET

IT WILL SOON BE VISIBLE IN EARLY MORNING SKY.

Queen's Astronomers Do Not Fear the Power of the Tail, Which Has Been Much Discussed—Millions of Miles From Earth.

Queen's university astronomers are looking forward to having at least a peep at Halley's comet. Within a few days the comet will be ahead of the sun, and may be seen in the early morning sky.

It will then be fifty million miles from the sun, and will keep brightening up and going ahead of the sun in the morning until May 1st, when it will then appear to approach the sun again. On May 18th the comet will pass between the sun and the earth about nine o'clock at night, but will not be visible here. It may be seen just before sundown at the Pacific coast, but will be best observed in Japan.

At the time of passing the earth and sun the comet will be about fourteen million miles above the earth, and if the tail reaches out far enough it will envelop the earth, but the components in the tail will be so alternated that the inhabitants of the earth will notice nothing unusual beyond a hazy appearance or glow in the sky. It will terminate at a point near Ansturey, a bright red star, which should be visible then. The relative velocity will be fifty miles a second, as the tail sweeps by, and on May 6th, as the earth crosses the orbit of the comet, a few meteors may reach the earth at that time.

After May 18th Halley's comet will appear to fly away from the sun, and finally disappear.

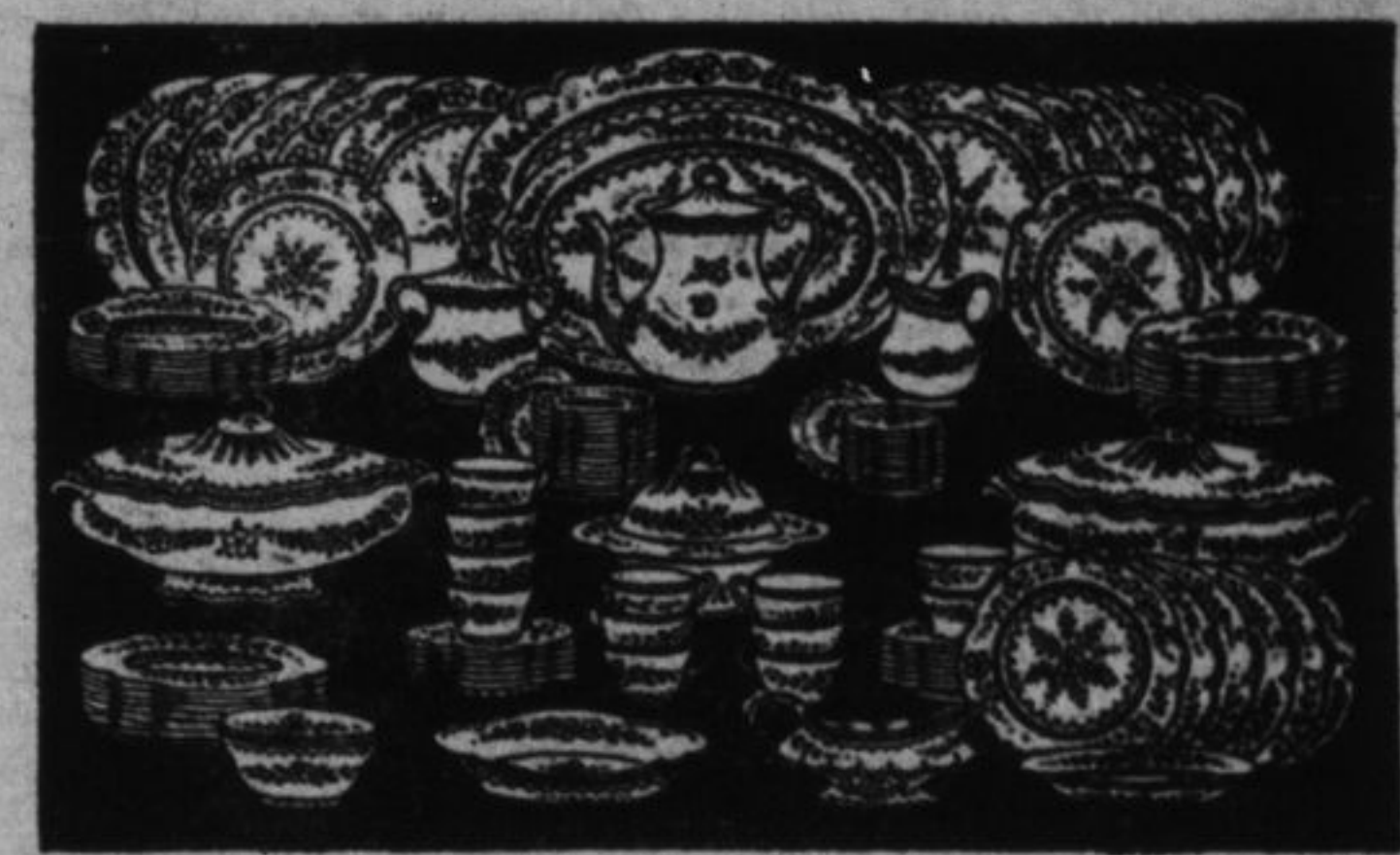
