Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any wife over 18 years old, has no more than a quarter-section of available townsite land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Agent's office or sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duration — Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, so long as he occupies his home on his homestead, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader is given an additional quarter-section section alongside his homestead, \$3.00 per acre. Duties — Must pay six months in each of two years, \$100.00 per acre, and a tax of \$1.00 per acre required to earn homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead rights and cannot obtain a presumption may take a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duration — Must reside six months in each of three years, \$100.00 per acre and a tax of \$1.00 per acre, worth \$200.00.
