BRITISH OWNER'S TEAM WON FAMOUS ALASKA DOG RACE.

\$250,000 Wagered on Result-Continuous Journey of 412 Miles Was Covered in 74 Hours 14 Minutes.

Tacoma, Wash., April 15 .- A Nome cable says the British nobility, for the first time, scored heavily in the dog racing annals of Alaska, by winning the first two prizes in the third annual All-Alaska Sweepstakes, the greatest dog race in the world, and breaking all previous records for continuous journey of 412 miles. Col. Ramsay's team of Siberian wrives covered the distance in 74 hours, 11 minutes and 20 seconds, defeating his nephew's team, of the same kind of dogs, by 1 hour, 55 minutes. Lord Fox Ramsay crossed the wire about of Allan by 24 minutes and 2 seconds. The wolf teams, owned by the Britishers, were backed heavily by miners shortly after the race started, when it was learned they had established an average speed of a little over eight miles an hour. The winning team set a heart-breaking pace, which soon placed it in the lead. The

first 300 miles of the gruelling journey were covered in 52 hours and 56 minutes, a record for the distance. Trophies to the winner are valued at \$11,000. A quarter of a million tiollars in money and gold dust was wagered on the result.
