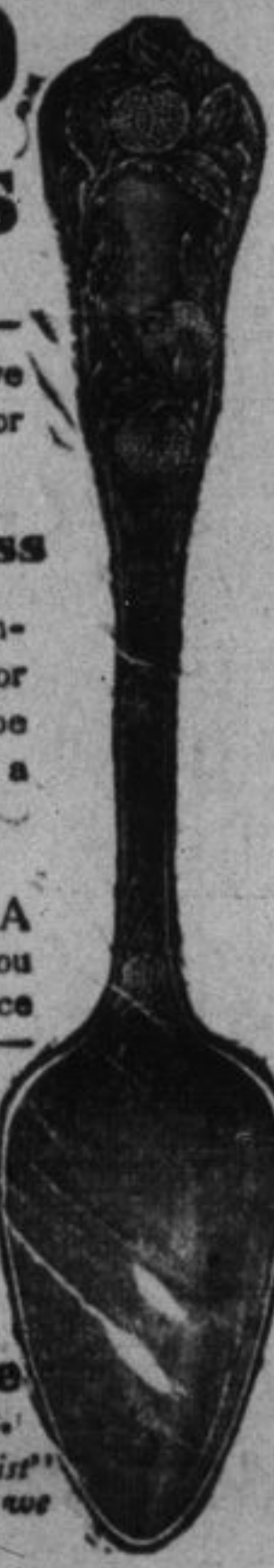

NEWS OF THE WORLD

OCCURRENCES RECOUNTED IN BRIEF FORM.

Matters That Interest Everybody—Notes From All Over—Little of Everything Easily Read and Remembered.

A strike of silver is reported from Pishin township, near Guelph. The Cork Accident predicts that Redmond will support the government in the crisis on Monday next. At Sedalia fifty striking shirt waist makers have decided to open a factory along co-operative lines. \$9,000,000 will be added to the payroll of the U. S. Steel Corporation by the first of next month. The first estimate received at Seattle of the spring gold clean-up in the neighborhood of Fairbanks, Alaska, is \$9,000,000. The famous German cobler known as the "Captain of Koenigsberg" will be deported from the United States as an undesirable alien. Canadian Manufacturers Association and the Toronto Board of Trade passed resolutions urging the depeaning of the Welland canal. Major Von Paravel's new aeroplane, which was being tested over Lake Placid in Germany, turned turtle in a gust of wind and fell into the lake. Thomas T. Blair, fireman, died and four others were seriously injured in the fire which destroyed the business section of Johnstown, Pa. Loss \$75,000. The New Brunswick government has appointed Col. D. McLeod, Woodstock, O. M. Melançon, Shediac, and G. D. D. Otty, Hampton, as members of the public utilities commission. The fight of the Shuberts against the Theatrical Trust received another impetus when it was announced that DeWolf Hopper and Marie Cahill would book through the Shuberts. At London Former Mayor Thomas L. Johnson, of Cleveland, refused to discuss the rumor that he is to make his future home in England. Johnson

CUPS WORTH \$11,000

BRITISH OWNER'S TEAM WON FAMOUS ALASKA DOG RACE.

\$250,000 Wagered on Result—Continuous Journey of 412 Miles Was Covered in 74 Hours 14 Minutes. Tacoma, Wash., April 15.—A Name cable says the British nobility, for the first time, scored heavily in the dog racing annals of Alaska, by winning the first two prizes in the third annual All-Alaska Sweepstakes, the greatest dog race in the world, and breaking all previous records for a continuous journey of 412 miles. Col. Ramsay's team of Siberian wolves covered the distance in 74 hours, 14 minutes and 20 seconds, defeating his nephew's team, of the same kind of dogs, by 1 hour, 55 minutes. Lord Fox-Ramsay crossed the wire ahead of Allan by 24 minutes and 2 seconds. The wolf teams, owned by the Britishers, were backed heavily by miners shortly after the race started, when it was learned they had established an average speed of a little over eight miles an hour. The winning team set a heart-breaking pace, which soon placed it in the lead. The first 300 miles of the gruelling journey were covered in 52 hours and 56 minutes, a record for the distance. Trophies to the winner are valued at \$11,000. A quarter of a million dollars in money and gold dust was wagered on the result.

FOOD IN COLD STORAGE.

Limit Should Be Nine Months, Reports Dr. Wiley.

Washington, D.C., April 15.—There is no excuse for delaying any article of food in cold storage for a period longer than nine months, according to a statement by Dr. W. H. Wiley, chief of the Bureau of Chemistry of the Department of Agriculture, presented to the senate today by Chairman Lodge, of the committee which is investigating the high cost of living. "Whenever the storage of a product is continued long enough to interfere with the output of the next season's crop," says Dr. Wiley, "it has been carried to a point beyond the limits of reasonable economy and practical hygiene." He says that the storage of strictly seasonal products should be prohibited by law, and that even canned goods, which are a benefit to the people, should not be carried over longer than the ending of one season and the beginning of the next.

MEMBERS TAKE ACTION.

Want Sir Robert Anderson Deprived of His Pension.

London, April 15.—The preliminary debate on Premier Asquith's veto resolution, has been overshadowed by the interest excited by the revelation of Sir Robert Anderson's share in the political events of 1887, and the determined efforts the Irish members are making in the house of commons to secure a government investigation of the affair, with a view of depriving Sir Robert of a pension of \$4,500 yearly, on the ground that his action was a breach of official confidence. Sir Robert Anderson has admitted the authorship of the famous "Parliament and Crime" series of articles which appeared in the Times in 1887, and which culminated in the publication of the Piggott forgery. Model Railways Cost Money.

Canadian Cobblers. The price of railways has gone up since the C.P.R. was built at an average cost of \$30,000 a mile. Some of the old hands in parliament, not understanding this, may confuse high initial expenditure with worst matters. The National Transcontinental railway will cost \$20,000 a mile, but for that money it will have almost a level straight road from coast to coast. Any graft there may be will come in the amount named. The government engineers have gone on the principle that the best is the cheapest in the long run—and it's a long run from Halifax to Prince Rupert. The C.P.R. has spent twice \$30,000 a mile lowering grades, straightening curves, and bringing the road up to the latest mark. From this lingering and expensive penance the National Transcontinental railway hopes to be cut off by getting in right at the start. If the western railway projectors had had the financial strength to build roads at the outset the total cost per mile would probably have been \$20,000 instead of \$30,000, but the \$60,000 afterward sent on improvements would have been saved. The Grand Trunk has found it necessary to spend millions on its round-bell between Toronto and Montreal—built cheaply in the first place—in order to compete with the lower cost of transportation on other roads. For similar reasons the C.P.R. has had to double-track between Winnipeg and Fort William, and the bill for western improvements this year will be \$20,000,000. All of which is not to say that the Lumsden committee may not discover irregularities, but it is well to remember that a suit to fit costs more than a hand-me-down.
