WHY KINGSTON FAILED TO LAND INDUSTRIES.

Report of C. A. Macpherson to the Board of Trade—Kingston Harbor Requires to be Improved, Says Francis King.

The Board of Trade at its annual meeting last evening was presented with a review of the past year's work, a connection with which some important questions were dealt with by C. A. Macpherson, the new president, and Francis King, chairman of the marine committee. Mr. Macpherson, in a lengthy report pointed out why Kingston had failed to get industries notwithstanding the fact that the Board of Trade and the Council Industries committees had been very active. He stated the reasons to be indifference, or a lack of confidence; a lack of local capital willing to invest; lack of cheap power and unsatisfactory railway facilities. He suggested that a committee composed of city council and board of trade representatives should study out what industries Kingston is best fitted to take care of. Mr. King spoke of what had been done towards passing the Dominion Government to begin the enlargement of the Welland Canal. The canal would come or later receive attention. In his message it was essential that Kingston should take steps to improve its harbor for the coming of larger boats. What was most needed was the removal of the present old Catarqui wharve and the erection of a larger wharve further east. He had written the city council about the matter and the council had appointed a committee to confer with the marine committee of the board. Mr. King said that he sooner these committees got together, the better.

The retiring secretary, E. J. Reid, reported that the board had 151 members. Ten regular meetings were held last year, and the average attendance was 29. The chief matters discussed during the year were the Welland canal project, the new bill of lading; street improvement; automobile stages; he bread bill; the eight-hour day bill; the waterways commission; better trade relations with Germany; the unincorporated municipal act; bonuses to new industries; the hotel question and the Kingston shipbuilding by-law. The treasurer, W. B. Dalton, reported the receipts for the year, including the surplus over from a year ago, to be \$2,036. There was now a balance of \$81 on hand.

For the railway committee, Dr. Reid reported that he would have a statement to make at the next regular meeting of the board. He had several important matters and suggestions to bring before the incoming committee. The retiring president, H. W. Richardson, spoke of the development throughout Canada, but noted that Kingston was not progressing as it ought to. The board's committees had worked diligently, but still there was much more that required to be done. "The growing stage is on," said Mr. Richardson, "and Kingston should move ahead faster than it is doing." The greater part of the north-west grain is going through by rail, because that is the cheaper route. The extension of the Welland canal will offset this, and Kingston, Mr. Richardson said, will benefit when the canal is enlarged.

A discussion took place on the reciprocal tariff recently agreed upon between Canada and the United States. Resolutions of appreciation of the work of the retiring president and secretary were passed. The officers for the ensuing year are: President—C. A. Macpherson. First vice-president—Dr. Edward Ryan. Second vice-president—D. G. Laird. Treasurer—W. B. Dalton. Council—C. Y. Chown, Elmer Davis, I. M. Farrell, W. R. Givens, John Hewton, Francis King, J. A. Mines, R. J. McKelvey, H. W. Richardson.

THE LATE WILLIAM ABERNETHY

was a Resident of Kingston Over Sixty Years.

In the decease of William Abernethy, of Ordnance street, on Tuesday afternoon, his family loses a devoted husband and father, and Kingston one of its most genial and kindhearted citizens. A universal favorite with his host of friends and acquaintances, he was a resident of Kingston for nearly sixty years, coming here when a mere lad, with his parents, from the township of Kingston, which was his birth place, and he resided here ever since. He was stricken with an apoplectic stroke two weeks ago and never regained consciousness. The late Mr. Abernethy was a member of the A.O.U.W., and was also one of the veteran members of I.O.O.F., being connected with Kingston lodge for nearly forty years. He was a veteran of the 1865-66 troubles. In religion he was a Methodist, an adherent of Brock street church, and in former years one of the stand-bys of the Old Primitive Methodist church. He was a staunch liberal in politics.

Besides his widow he is survived by five daughters and one son: Mrs. T. M. Asselatin, Kingston; Mrs. H. N. Eumous, East Orange, N.J.; Misses Maul and Ethel, New York; Norman, of Winnipeg and Hazel at home, Mrs. I. A. Jenkins, of this city is a sister, and a brother Thomas lives at Carleton Place. The funeral will take place at Catarqui cemetery Thursday, at 2:30 p.m.
