SIR O'MOORE CREGH, COMMANDER OF BRITISH FORCES IN INDIA -General Sir O'Moore Creagh has been commander-in-chief of the British forces in India since last year. In the photograph he is seated with Lady O'Moore Creagh and his staff. General O'Moore Creagh was educated at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, and entered the army as ensign in the Ninety-fifth foot, in 1866. The Indian army he entered in 1870, becoming the honorary colonel of the Forty-fourth Merwara infantry in 1889. He was decorated for valor in the Afghan war of 1879-80. In 1895 he was made assistant quartermaster-general of Bombay, and acted as political resident and general oficer commanding Aden from 1898-1900. In 1901 he served in China, when he was mentioned in despatches, and has served in many other expeditions.


